FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Port Vincent Primary School and Aquatic Centre, P.O. Box 116, Port Vincent, S.A. 5581 or persons acting as their agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder'), are exempt from the Fisheries Act 1982, in that the permit holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking and possessing one southern Rock Lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity') from the waters specified in Schedule 1, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of his notice until 30 September 1999.

SCHEDULE 1

South Australian marine coastal waters adjacent to Port Moorowie.

SCHEDULE 2

1. All organisms taken by the permit holder are for display purposes only and may not be sold.

2. An employee of the Port Vincent Primary School and Aquatic Centre must be present at all times whilst conducting the permitted activity.

3. The permit holder may only release the Southern Rock Lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to this notice if it is kept separate from specimens taken from other locations.

4. Subject to condition 3, the Southern Rock Lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) taken pursuant to this notice must be released as near as practicable to the point of capture.

5. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

6. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity, the permit holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer. 7. Before collecting any organisms pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must advise a Fisheries Compliance Officer of PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture on 1800 065 522 with the following details:

- of the proposed location for collection;
- the proposed time and date on which the collections are to be made;
- details of any boats which may be used in the permitted activity; and
- the name of the authorised person conducting the permitted activity.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Hayden Barber, 628 Glynburn Road, Beaumont, S.A. 5066 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder'), is exempt from sections 34 and 41 of the fisheries Act 1982 but only insofar as he may take beche-de-mere (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity') subject to the conditions in Schedule 1 for the purposes of trade or business.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The permit holder may engage in the permitted activity from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2000.

2. Fish may only be taken from waters of the State between lines of latitude $133^{\circ}E$ and $135^{\circ}E$.

3. The permit holder and one other person may take fish pursuant to this notice. The person assisting the permit holder must, at all times whilst conducting the permitted xtivity, remain within 50 m of the permit holder. Fish may only be taken by diving and collection by hand.

4. The permit holder may take no more than 1500 kg of beche-de-mere in any one week.

5. The permit holder must provide the Director of Fisheries separate statistical catch and effort information, in the form of a daily log as provided.

6. The permit holder shall notify the PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to conducting the permitted activity with the following information:

- (a) details of the boat that will be used to engage in the permitted activity;
- (b) the intended area of conducting the permitted activity;
- (c) the intended place and time of launching and retrieval of the nominated boat for that day; and
- (d) the name of the diver (if any) who will be assisting the permit holder.

7. While engaged in the permitted activity the permit holder shall carry or have about or near their person a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer upon request.

8. PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture retains the right for a departmental officer to accompany the permit holder at any time whilst conducting the permitted activity.

9. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

 - (b) produce a copy of the notice if required by a Fisheries Compliance Officer.

3. PIRSA Fisheries retains the right for a departmental officer or an officer of the South Australian Research and Development Institute to accompany the fisher at any time while engaged in the permitted activity.

4. The fisher must provide separate statistical catch and effort information, in the form of a daily log, with details of fishing conducted pursuant to the permitted activity.

5. The fisher shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulation made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

5. The fisher shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulation made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

Activities involving the taking, possessing and subsequent release of aquatic organisms (not including species protected pursuant to section 42 of the Fisheries Act 1982) from the waters specified in Schedule 2 for education purposes at the Port Vincent Primary School and Aquatic Centre.

SCHEDULE 2

South Australian marine coastal waters of Gulf St Vincent, including intertidal rocky reef areas, adjacent to Dowcer Bluff.

SCHEDULE 3

1. All organisms taken by the permit holder are for display purposes only and may not be sold.

2. An employee of the Port Vincent Primary School and Aquatic Centre must be present at all times whilst conducting the permitted activity.

3. No more than five of any species may be taken or possessed at any one time.

4. The permit holder must ensure organisms taken pursuant to this notice are kept only when specimens are taken from the same location. 5. All organisms released pursuant to this notice must be released as near as practicable to the point of capture.

6. Within 14 days of the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must provide a report in writing to the Director of Fisheries (Attention: Roger Hill, G.P.O. Box 1625, Adelaide, S.A. 5001), giving following details:

- the date and time of collection;
- the name and number of each species taken, including any mortalities resulting from collecting;
- and details of any organisms released.

7. The permit holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by the notice.

8. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity, the permit holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer.

9. Before collecting any organisms pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must advise a Fisheries Compliance Officer of PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture on 1800 065 522 with the following details:

- of the proposed location for collection;
- the proposed time and date on which the collections are to be made;
- details of any boats which may be used in the permitted activity; and
- the name of the authorised person conducting the permitted activity.

10. The permitted activity shall be undertaken in a manner to ensure minimal disturbance of the reef.

4. The fisher must provide separate statistical catch and effort information, in the form of a daily log, with details of fishing conducted pursuant to the permitted activity. 5. The fisher shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulation made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

Whilst engaged in the collection activity the fisher must have in or about their possession the copy of this notice with which the Director of Fisheries has provided and produce that notice to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer forthwith, if and when an officer requests the fisher to produce it.

2. The total number of razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken in any one day, shall be no greater than 150.

3. The fisher must include all razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken under this permit on their monthly catch and effort summary provided to the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI).

4. The fisher shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

5. Whilst engaged in the collection activity the fisher must have in or about their possession the copy of this notice with which the Director of Fisheries has provided and produce that notice to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer forthwith, if and when an officer requests the fisher to produce it.
