1 THE ECONOMIC CONTEXT

The Australian economy grew solidly in 1998-99 and indicators of economic activity suggest a slower, but nevertheless robust, rate of growth for 1999-2000. Continued buoyancy of the economy caused the Reserve Bank to raise interest rates in November and February to support sustainable longer-term growth. The South Australian economy has shown more variable trends, with Gross State Product (GSP) increasing in real terms by 6.4 per cent in 1997-98 and by a slower rate of 2.1 per cent in 1998-99. At both the national and State level, it is expected that the rate of economic growth will remain solid through the forecast period. Projections for 2001-2002 and 2002-03 are based on the expected performance of the Australian economy over the medium-term and relative population growth rates, indicating a 3 per cent per annum GSP and State Final Demand growth rate for South Australia.

Forecasts for economic activity in 1999-2000 are generally stronger than predicted at the time of the last Budget. This may be partially due to the impact of the GST, ie bringing forward some household expenditure as well as the improved international outlook. South Australia's overseas export growth has been particularly strong.

Forecasts of employment growth for South Australia, as seen in Table 1, are based on wage and salary employment (which accounts for over 80 per cent of total employment). Employment growth is expected to be in the range of 2¾ per cent per annum in 1999-2000, based on the recent strength shown in the data and the pre-GST stimulus to national dwelling construction activity and flow-on household expenditure.

After a significant period of subdued inflation trends, there has been a recent pick-up in inflation. However, the rate of inflation remains low by historical levels. 'Underlying' inflation both in South Australia and nationally is expected to remain moderate (at around $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent per annum). The introduction of the new tax system from 1 July 2000 is expected by Commonwealth Treasury to add around 3 percentage points to the 'headline' rate of CPI growth in 2000-01. Wages growth is expected to remain moderate over the forecast period.

Table 1 below provides a summary of key economic parameters in the next few years, for both South Australia and Australia.

2 1999-2000 BUDGET POSITION AND OUTLOOK

Introduction

The 1999-2000 Budget position and outlook are presented on two bases, the non-commercial underlying deficit presentation and the uniform budget presentation framework. Both use ABS government financial statistics (GFS) concepts, but they have different scope and treatment of some items. The South Australian Government's fiscal strategy is to balance the budget of the non-commercial sector. In South Australia, the public trading enterprises that are supported in significant part by the Budget and/or integrated into social policy functions are included in the non-commercial sector in line with the recommendations of the South Australian Commission of Audit (1994). In the uniform presentation for government financial statistics (GFS) presented in Section 3, these public trading enterprises are included in the public trading enterprises sector. The South Australian non-commercial sector presentation includes net advances and excludes abnormal items, whereas the uniform presentation framework excludes net advances and does not separately identify an abnormal item category.

Commentary in this review is based on the non-commercial sector underlying deficit presentation.

Overview

The non-commercial sector revised estimates for 1999-2000 to 2002-2003 are presented in Table 2. The financial position is expected to deteriorate over the current and forward years from the original budget by an estimated \$46 million in 1999-2000 and around \$30 million in each of the out-years. This is largely due to the removal of the power bill increase — as a result of Parliamentary approval of the electricity asset disposal process. The expected revenue from the power bill increase was broadly equivalent to the expected benefit to the budget, in terms of interest savings over and above revenue lost from dividends and tax equivalent payments, from disposing of all the electricity assets. At this stage only the proceeds relating to the disposal of ETSA Power and ETSA Utilities have been received. Consequently the loss of the power bill revenue is not fully offset by the net revenue gain from interest savings in excess of dividends and tax equivalent payments. This shortfall is greater in 1999-2000 as the benefits from the ETSA Power and ETSA Utilities disposal is only available for part of the year.

Sale/Lease of ETSA

On 28 January 2000, the State Government received \$3.4 billion for the lease of ETSA Power and ETSA Utilities. In addition there was a \$94 million benefit in terms of future superannuation liabilities in respect of employees of those organisations. As a result of the transaction, Standard and Poor's have increased the State's credit rating from AA to AA+.

The outlook for 2000-2001 and the forward years includes the impact of the lease of ETSA Utilities and ETSA Power on outlays and revenues. However the forecasts do not include the anticipated benefits to the budget from the sale/lease of the remaining electricity entities as the outcome of these transactions is not yet known. The impacts of the lease arrangement on the underlying non-commercial sector deficit are the following:

- Removal of the power bill increase.
- Loss of dividends and tax equivalent payments from ETSA Power and ETSA Utilities.
- Savings in interest costs associated with the retirement of debt from sale/lease proceeds.
- Funding the superannuation liability of former ETSA employees.

Outlays

Total outlays over the period have been revised downwards since the publication of the Budget. This decrease mainly reflects the following developments:

- The net impact of the ETSA sale/lease resulting in an estimated reduction in outlays over the four years of \$547 million. This largely reflects savings in interest costs as a result of the retirement of debt from the proceeds of the lease process.
- Changes to the funding of superannuation in 1999-2000 as a result of the actual budget outcome for 1998-99. Large cash surpluses in 1998-99 enabled additional funding for superannuation to be provided in 1998-99. This will result in a saving of \$126 million due to the prepayment of accruing superannuation liabilities previously budgeted for 1999-2000 and a saving of \$113 million due to the earlier than scheduled payment of unfunded superannuation liabilities in 1998-99.
- Reclassification of revenue from drivers' licence fees as an offset to expenditure (instead of a tax receipt) to conform with Australian Bureau of Statistics standards.

These reductions are partially offset by the anticipated increases in outlays primarily as a result of National Tax Reform. New outlays include a First Home Owners Scheme where eligible first home buyers will be able to claim a \$7,000 rebate from the State to compensate for GST induced price impacts on housing costs. In addition, South Australia will make a contribution to the Australian Taxation Office for the costs of administering the GST.

The reform measures will lead to a reclassification of any ongoing fuel and liquor subsidies. These payments were previously offset against Commonwealth replacement grants. From 2000-01 onwards, such subsidies will be classified as outlays resulting in higher outlay levels.

These additional outlays resulting from tax reform (other than implementation costs) are estimated to amount to \$85.3 million in 2000-01, \$53.1 million in 2001-02 and \$54.7 million in 2002-03.

These increases have no net impact on the deficit and are funded by increases to Commonwealth grants receipts and adjustments to taxation receipts.

Other increases in outlays will result from:

- Carryover of expenditure from 1998-99.
- Grants and subsidies paid these have been revised upwards reflecting increases in specific purpose funds from the Commonwealth for non-government schools and health and a change in reporting arrangements for National Heritage Trust grants. There is no net impact on the deficit from these changes.

Revenue

Revisions to the revenue outlook mainly reflect the following developments since the 1999-2000 Budget release:

- Income distributions from the electricity entities have been revised down as a result of a decision not to proceed with the power bill increase, following Parliament's approval for the long term lease of the State's electricity entities.
- Income distributions from SA Water Corporation have also been revised down and sales tax equivalent payments by liable entities have been removed from 2000-01 onwards reflecting the abolition of sales tax from 1 July 2000; the loss of sales tax equivalents will, however, be compensated by additional general purpose funding from the Commonwealth under GST funding arrangements.
- The sale of electricity assets has generated a large stamp duty receipt in 1999-2000 equivalent to a net \$102.6 million which impacts on the level of taxation receipts. This revenue has been treated as an abnormal item in determining the revised estimate of the underlying deficit for 1999-2000.

- Since the Budget was delivered, concessions and remissions (excluding pensioner concessions) for the emergency services levy have increased by \$21.6 million.
- Underlying improvements in taxation revenues mainly reflect:
 - revised estimates of tobacco replacement grants following agreement between the Commonwealth and the States on a methodology for estimating surcharge collections as if excise continued to be levied on a weight basis rather than a 'per stick' basis;
 - stronger levels of stamp duty revenue from property transfers reflecting increased housing market activity;
 - growth in gaming machine taxation revenue.
- These sources of taxation revenue improvement are partially offset by higher than budgeted expenditure on payroll tax rebates for trainees and, for 1999-2000, by lower than budgeted collections of stamp duty on motor vehicle transfers, thought to be reflecting the deferral of some purchasing decisions until after the introduction of the GST and the abolition of wholesale sales tax.
- Classification changes have also led to revisions to taxation estimates. Under national tax reform, franchise fee replacement grants will be absorbed into GST revenues and any ongoing petrol and liquor subsidies will be shown as gross payments rather than netted against taxation revenue; the Mid-Year Budget Review reflects this treatment. A change in the classification of drivers' licence fees, on the other hand, has a downward impact on taxation levels. To conform with revised Australian Bureau of Statistics standards, drivers' licence fees are now classified as offsets to expenditure rather than as taxation receipts.
- Excluding classification changes and stamp duty on the sale of electricity entities, the underlying change since Budget in taxation revenue estimates ranges from a deterioration of \$4 million in 1999-2000 to a \$30 million improvement by 2002-03.
- The implementation of national tax reform also results in the recognition of other payments (for example, the cost of the first home owners' (FHOS) scheme and costs of GST tax collection); these expenditures are matched in the forward estimates by an increase in general purpose Commonwealth funds reflecting transitional guarantee funding arrangements designed to ensure that no State Budget is worse off under national tax reform.
- Specific purpose funds from the Commonwealth have been revised up since Budget mainly reflecting revised funding levels for non-government schools and health and changes in reporting arrangements for Natural Heritage Trust grants. These revisions have no net impact on the budget result.

I refer to applications for authorisation of the National Electricity Code submitted to the Commission on 26 July 1999 and amended on 18 August 1999, and your letter dated 17 January 2000, which requested that the Commission grant interim authorisation to the following clauses, relating to entrepreneurial interconnectors:

Pursuant to subsection 91 (2) of the Act, the Commission hereby grants interim authorisation for the above Code changes, with the exception that the interim authorisation does not apply to clause 5.5A(g)(2)(A).

The interim authorisation is granted subject to the following conditions:

C1 Clause 5.5A(g)(1A) be amended to provide that:

'Service level standards to which the MNSP requires the NSP to adhere in providing it services to the extent that the MNSP is seeking a service level higher than that in this Code or set by the relevant regulator.'

C2 Clause 6.1.4A be amended to provide that:

'Chapter 6 does not govern the principles or rules for the calculation of prices which a Market Network Service Provider may charge for its services. However, a Market Network Service Provider is obliged to pay any applicable charges determined in accordance with Chapter 6.'

The Commission has received submissions from interested parties, expressing some concerns with the safe harbour provisions for entrepreneurial interconnectors. The Commission will conduct a full assessment of the Code changes and submissions in its draft determination and may, if it considers necessary, impose conditions that are additional to those imposed in this interim authorisation. Please note that the interim authorisation will lapse when the Commission reaches a final determination in regard to the applications and that, under subsection 91 (2) of the Trade Practices Act, the Commission may revoke an interim authorisation at any time.

National Electricity Code—Applications for Authorisation Nos: A90704, A90705 and A90706

I refer to my letter of 31 January 2000, advising you of the Commission's decision to grant interim authorisation to a set of Code changes related to entrepreneurial interconnectors as per your request of 17 January 2000. The interim authorisation did not cover clause 5.5A (g) (2) (A) and was subject to two conditions.

Condition C2: Clause 6.1.4A

Condition 2 of the interim authorisation required clause 6.1.4A of the proposed Code changes to be amended to provide that:

Chapter 6 does not govern the principles or rules for the calculation of prices which a Market Network Service Provider may charge for its services. However, a Market Network Service Provider is obliged to pay any applicable charges determined in accordance with Chapter 6.

The intention of Condition 2 was to amend clause 6.1.4A so that if, in the future, Chapter 6 determined prices that a Market Network Service Provider (MNSP) must pay for use of the transmission or distribution network, the interim authorisation would cover that arrangement.

The Commission has since been informed that Condition 2 may be misinterpreted as meaning that MNSP's must pay the usage component of Customer Transmission Use of System (TUOS) charges.

Consequently, the Commission has decided to amend Condition 2 so that interim authorisation is subject to the condition that Chapter 6 not apply to charges paid by a MNSP for transmission or distribution services. Charges for network services provided to a MNSP must be determined in accordance with Clause 5.5A of the Code.

Condition 2 of the interim authorisation now reads:

C2 Clause 6.1.4A must be amended to provide that:

Chapter 6 does not govern the principles or rules for the calculation of prices a Market Network Service Provider may charge for its services, nor the charges for transmission or distribution services provided by a Network Service Provider to a Market Network Service Provider. Charges for network services provided to a Market Network Service Provider are governed by the provisions of clause 5.5A.

It is important to note that the Commission is still in the process of assessing the complete package of Code changes arising from the Transmission and Distribution Pricing Review and has not yet formed a view on issues such as who should pay TUOS charges.

Operation of Interim Authorisation

I am concerned that some parties may have misinterpreted the status of an interim authorisation. Parties should be aware that:

• the Commission may revoke or vary the imterim authorisation (including conditions to which the interim authorisation is subject) at any time and the interim authorisation terminates when the Commission makes a final determination on the application; and the interim authorisation has been granted pending a full review of the Code changes and submissions. The Commission may reach a different conclusion on the appropriate charging arrangements for network services provided to an MNSP that are currently granted interim authorisation.

Clause 5.5A (g) (2) (A)

The Commission did not grant interim authorisation in respect of clause $5.5A\ (g)\ (2)\ (A)$, which provides for the Network Service Provider and the MNSP to negotiate in good faith on the 'use of system service charges to be paid to the MNSP in respect of any reduction in the long run marginal cost of augmenting the network as a result of it being connected to the network'. The Commission is aware that there is a potential inconsistency in the treatment of generators and MNSP's with respect to such payments.

As indicated above, it should be noted that the Commission has not reached a view on the charging arrangements for network services provided to MNSP's. The Commission will consider this issue in the draft determination on the Transmission and Distribution Pricing Review Code changes.

Chapter 10 Definitions

I wish to clarify that the interim authorisation referred to in my letter of 31 January 2000, covers the definitions in Chapter 10 that are relevant to entrepreneurial interconnectors. The relevant definitions are listed in Attachment 1 to this letter.

Notice of Exemption

I, DIANA LAIDLAW, Minister for Transport and Urban Planning, grant the following exemption pursuant to Regulation 7 of the Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 1999:

I exempt drivers of public buses travelling on the South Eastern Freeway from the provisions of Rule 177 (Stopping on Freeway) provided:

- (a) The bus has stopped solely for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers; and
- (b) The bus stops only at bus zones on the Freeway specifically set aside and designated by sign for that purpose.

This exemption is effective immediately.

All other provisions contained in the Road Traffic Act 1961 and the Australian Road Rules continue to have full force and effect.

I exempt pedestians boarding or alighting from, or waiting to board a public bus on the South Eastern Freeway from the provisions of Rule 229 (Pedestrians on a road with a road access sign) provided the pedestrians:

- (a) are in a bus zone specifically set aside and designated by sign for that purpose; and
- (b) do not move beyond the kerbing which separates the road related area and road of that zone.

In this notice, 'public bus' and 'bus zone' have the same meaning as defined for the purposes of the Australian Road Rules. Dated 10 March 2000.

Exemption for Semi-Trailers to Exceed 12.3 m in Length Between the Point of Articulation and the Rear of the Trailer

PURSUANT to Section 163AA of the Road Traffic Act 1961, I, T. N. Argent, Executive Director, Transport SA, authorised delegate of the Minister for Transport and Urban Planning, hereby exempt semi-trailers from the requirements of Rule 68(1)(b) Length of single trailers, of the Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules 1999.

This exemption is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. This Notice or a legible copy shall be carried by the driver of the vehicle at all times when operating under this exemption and be produced when requested by an Inspector appointed under the Road Traffic Act 1961, or a Police Officer.
- 2. A semi-trailer manufactured on or after 1 July 1991 must be certified by the Australian Motor Vehicle Certification Board as an over dimension vehicle.

Note that the following dimensional requirements are extant:

- 1. The distance between the point of articulation at the front of the trailer and the rear of the trailer must not exceed 13.2 m.
- 2. The distance between the point of articulation at the front of the trailer and the rear overhang line must not exceed 9.5 m.
- 3. The projection forward of the point of articulation at the front of the semi-trailer must be contained within a radius of 1.9 m from the point of articulation.
- 4. The maximum overall length of the prime mover semi-trailer combination must not exceed 19 m.

This exemption is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That all axles are fitted with dual tyres
- 2. That the wheels and tyres fitted to an axle of the vehicle must be of sufficient size and capacity to carry the part of the vehicle's gross mass transmitted to the ground through the axle.
- 3. That the mass carried on the pig trailer does not exceed the lesser of:
 - 3.1. The manufacturer's specified Aggregate Trailer Mass; or
 - 3.2. The manufacturer's specified Gross Trailer Mass; or
 - 3.3. The Gross Vehicle Mass Limit specified by the Registering Authority; or
 - 3.4. 9.0 tonnes.

- 4. The mass carried on the pig trailer does not exceed the lesser of:
 - 4.1 The manufacturer's specified Aggregate Trailer Mass; or
 - 4.2 The manufacturer's specified Gross Trailer Mass; or
 - 4.3 The Gross Vehicle Mass Limit specified by the Registering Authority; or
 - 4.4 16.5 tonnes.
