FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 and Falie Project Ltd, P.O. Box 470, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015 (herein-after referred to as the 'exemption holder') are exempt from the provisions of Regulation 18 and Clauses 66, 70, 73, 77A, 77C and 77D of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 and section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as the exemption holder may exceed the boat limits as specified in Schedule 2 and may fillet fish on board the permitted boat (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Falie* (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted boat') from Falie Project Ltd in South Australian waters for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to nearest whole number if necessary) (for those species of scalefish subject to such a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000) per other exemption holder in any one day, where the number of other exemption holders exceeds six, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants.
- 2. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than one rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) per other exemption holder in any one day where the number of other exemption holders exceeds eight, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants.
- 3. The exemption holders may engage in the taking of no more than one abalone (*Haliotis spp.*) per other exemption holder in any one day where the number of other exemption holders exceeds 10, excluding the principal exemption holder and assistants.

4. The exemption holder may fillet and store fish caught from the permitted boat during the period of a fishing trip exceeding 24 hours.

SCHEDULE 3

- 1. This exemption is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002, unless varied or revoked earlier.
- 2. The exemption holder shall not use any boat other than the permitted boat for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.
- 3. The exemption holder shall not sell any fish taken pursuant to this notice.
- 4. The exemption holder must contact PIRSA Fisheries Compliance on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to commencing the exempted activity and advise the time and date of departure of the permitted boat and the estimated time of return to port.
- 5. All employees of the exemption holder on board the permitted boat must have completed an instruction session with the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit prior to undertaking the exempted activity.
- 6. All fish filleted during a trip must be left with the skin intact and stored with not more than two fillets per bag. Each bag must be marked with the date of capture.
- 7. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.
- 8. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder shall have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Helen Tassie, Education Officer of the Malacological Society of South Australia Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), c/o Marine Invertebrates Section, South Australian Museum, North Terrace, Adelaide, S.A. 5000, or her agents are exempt from the provisions of Clause 65 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2 from 25 January 2002 to 31 January 2002 inclusive.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of aquatic organisms from South Australian coastal waters (including intertidal rocky reefs) adjacent to Port MacDonnell.

SCHEDULE 2

- 1. All specimens collected by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must not be sold.
- 2. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must notify PIRSA Fisheries Compliance on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.
- 3. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must carry identification proving membership of the Malacological Society.
- 4. Within 14 days of the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must provide a report in writing to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Roger Hill, G.P.O. Box 1625, Adelaide, S.A. 5001), giving the following details:
 - the date and time of collection;
 - · the description of all species collected; and
 - the number of each species collected.
- 5. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.
- 6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
