FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Tony Lee (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), Lot 1, Bay Road, Moorak, S.A. 5291, is exempt from section 34 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as the exemption holder may take Turbo (*Turbo undulatis*) for the purpose of trade or business from South Australian coastal waters (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity') subject to the conditions in Schedule 1 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2004, unless revoked or varied earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The exemption holder may only take turbo (*Turbo undulatis*) by diving and collection by hand.
2. The exemption holder may take no more than 1 000 kg of Turbo (*Turbo undulatis*) in any one calendar month.
3. The exemption holder must provide the Director of Fisheries with separate statistical catch and effort information, in the form of a daily log as provided by the Director. The exemption holder must fill out the log every day and send a completed monthly log to the Director no later than the fifteenth day of the following month to the address specified.
4. The exemption holder shall notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 prior to conducting the exempted activity with the following information:
 - details of the boat that will be used to engage in the exempted activity;
 - the intended area of conducting the exempted activity; and
 - the intended place and time of launching and retrieval of the nominated boat for that day.

5. PIRSA Fisheries retains the right for a departmental officer to accompany the exemption holder at any time during fishing operations.

6. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder shall carry or have about or near his person a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

7. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Dale Steele, 62 Bay Road, Moonta, S.A. 5558 (the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from clauses 66, 73, 77A and 77C of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holders may exceed the prescribed boat limits during a chartered fishing trip on the *Wildfish II* in accordance with the allowable limits specified in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3, from 1 November 2003 until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Wildfish II* from Dale Steele for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

1. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to the nearest whole number if necessary) for those species of scalefish subject to a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000) in any one day.

2. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than eight cuttlefish or eight calamary or eight cuttlefish and/or calamary in combination, in any one day.

3. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking either one gummy shark or one school shark in any one day.

4. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds eight, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than one rock lobster in any one day.

5. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds 10, each 'other exemption holder' may take no more than one abalone in any one day.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The principal exemption holder, its employees or agents must not take any fish during the chartered fishing trip.

2. The principal exemption holder must not use any boat other than the *Wildfish II* for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.

3. The exemption holders must not sell any fish taken pursuant to this notice.

4. The principal exemption holder must not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.

5. The principal exemption holder must contact PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to commencing the exempted activity and advise the time and date of departure of the *Wildfish II* and the estimated time of return to port.

6. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.

7. The exemption holders must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, David Ellis from CSIRO Land and Water, PMB 2, Glen Osmond, S.A. 5064 (the 'exemption holder') or persons acting as his agent, are exempt from the provisions of the Fisheries Act 1982 and the Fisheries (Aquatic Reserves) Regulations 1989, to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 September 2005, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of marine organisms, core samples and translocation of marine organisms from all marine waters of South Australia bounded between Port Gawler and Sellicks Beach, including intertidal 'rocky' reefs and aquatic reserves.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder may be used for scientific purposes only and must not be sold.

2. Collections undertaken from intertidal 'rocky' reef areas and aquatic reserves must be undertaken with due consideration of other members of the public already in the area.

3. Before conducting the exempted activity, the exemption holders must contact PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 and provide the following information:

- name of the person or persons who will be conducting the exempted activity; and
- details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

4. The exemption holders must provide an annual report in writing detailing the outcomes of the research and the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Kristy Power, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) by 31 October 2004 and 31 October 2005 respectively, giving the following details:

- the date, time and location of collection;
- the description of all species collected; and
- the number of each species collected.

5. The exemption holder may not conduct any other fishing activity whilst undertaking the exempted activity.

6. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice which must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.

7. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
