FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Tracey Steggle of the River Murray Catchment Water Management Board, P.O. Box 1374, Berri, S.A. 5343 or persons acting as her agents (the 'exemption holders'), are exempt from section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982 and the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 insofar as they may engage in the collection of fish (the 'exempted activity') from the waters described in Schedule 1, using the gear specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 December 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holders are for scientific and research purposes only and must not be sold.

2. All native fish taken pursuant to the exempted activity must be immediately returned to the water unless retained for the purpose of species identification.

3. A maximum of five fish of any species per location may be taken for the purpose of species identification.

4. Before conducting the exempted activity, the exemption holders must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity, details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

5. The exemption holders must provide a report in writing detailing the outcomes of the research and the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Kristy Power, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within three months of the expiry of this notice, giving the following details:

- the date, time and location of collection;
- the description of all species collected; and
- the number of each species collected.

6. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holders must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

7. The exemption holders shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Helen Tassie, Education Officer of the Malacological Society of South Australia Inc. (the 'exemption holder'), c/o Marine Invertebrates Section, South Australian Museum, North Terrace, Adelaide, S.A. 5000, or her agents are exempt from the provisions of Clause 65 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 insofar as she may engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2, from 22 December 2003 to 28 December 2003 inclusive, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of aquatic organisms from South Australian coastal waters (including intertidal rocky reefs) adjacent to Fleurieu Peninsula.

SCHEDULE 2

1. Aquatic organisms collected by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must not be sold.

2. Before collecting any aquatic organisms pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must notify PIRSA Fisheries Compliance on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

3. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must carry identification proving membership of the Malacological Society of South Australia.

4. Within 14 days of the collection of aquatic organisms pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must provide a report in writing to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Kristy Power, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015), giving the following details:

- the date and time of collection;
- the description of all species collected; and
- the number of each species collected.

5. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

6. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Anthony Tiss, 6A Hood Street, Hillcrest, S.A. 5086 (the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from clauses 66, 70, 73, 77A and 77C of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holders may exceed the prescribed boat limits during a chartered fishing trip on the *Southern Freedom* in accordance with the allowable limits specified in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3, from 1 November 2003 until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Southern Freedom* from Anthony Tiss or Bubble Charters for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

1. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to the nearest whole number if necessary) for those species of scalefish subject to a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000) in any one day.

2. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than eight cuttlefish or eight calamary or eight cuttlefish and/or calamary in combination in any one day.

3. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking either one gummy shark or one school shark in any one day.

4. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds eight, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than one rock lobster in any one day.

5. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds 10, each 'other exemption holder' may take no more than one abalone in any one day.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The principal exemption holder, its employees or agents must not take any fish during the chartered fishing trip.

2. The principal exemption holder must not use any boat other than the *Southern Freedom* for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.

3. The exemption holders must not sell any fish taken pursuant to this notice.

4. The principal exemption holder must not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.

5. The principal exemption holder must contact PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to commencing the exempted activity and advise the time and date of departure of the *Southern Freedom* and the estimated time of return to port.

6. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.

7. The exemption holders must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Brenton Gamble, 78 Haylock Road, Moonta, S.A. 5558 (the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from clauses 66, 77A, 77B and 77C of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holders may exceed the prescribed boat limits during a chartered fishing trip on the *Bluefin Charter* in accordance with the allowable limits specified in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3, from 1 November 2003 until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Bluefin Charter* from Brenton Gamble or Blue Fin Fishing Charters for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

1. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to the nearest whole number if necessary) for those species of scalefish subject to a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000) in any one day.

2. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than 20 blue crabs or 20 sand crabs or 20 blue crabs and/or sand crabs in combination in any one day.

3. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking no more than eight cuttlefish or eight calamary or eight cuttlefish and/or calamary in combination in any one day.

4. Where the number of 'other exemption holders' exceeds six, all of the 'other exemption holders' on board the boat are each restricted to taking either one gummy shark or one school shark in any one day.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The principal exemption holder, its employees or agents must not take any fish during the chartered fishing trip.

2. The principal exemption holder must not use any boat other than the *Bluefin Charter* for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.

3. The exemption holders must not sell any fish taken pursuant to this notice.

4. The principal exemption holder must not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.

5. The principal exemption holder must contact PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to commencing the exempted activity and advise the time and date of departure of the *Bluefin Charter* and the estimated time of return to port.

6. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.

7. The exemption holders must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, the persons listed in Schedule 1 (the 'exemption holders'), are exempt from section 34 of the Fisheries Act 1982 and the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991, but only insofar as they may take greenlip abalone (*Haliotis laevis*) for the purpose of trade or business (the 'exempted activity') in the waters specified in Schedule 2 subject to the conditions in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 2

South Australian coastal waters between the meridians of longitude 136°30' east and 139° east but does not include the waters of the Coorong and or other waters inside the Murray Mouth.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holders may engage in the exempted activity from 20 October 2003 until 30 June 2004.

2. The exemption holders may take a maximum of 200 greenlip abalone (*Haliotis laevis*) in total during the period commencing on 20 October 2003 and ending on 30 June 2004.

3. Abalone taken pursuant to this notice may only be used as abalone broodstock and must not be sold or transferred to another party.

4. All abalone taken pursuant to this notice must be delivered to and retained on the registered aquaculture site of landbased Aquaculture Licence No. FT00558.

5. Once abalone taken pursuant to this notice have been delivered to the registered aquaculture site they must not be taken from the aquaculture site and returned to any waters outside that aquaculture site.

6. The exemption holders must notify PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to conducting the exempted activity with the following information:

- details of the boat that will be used to engage in the exempted activity;
- the name of the person or persons who will be conducting the exempted activity;
- the intended place and time of launching and retrieval of the nominated boat for that day; and
- the intended area of conducting the exempted activity.

7. The exemption holders must, within 50 m of the point of landing of any abalone taken pursuant to this notice, ensure that the PIRSA Fisheries form 'Abalone Broodstock Collection Statement' is completed. Immediately upon arrival at the exemption holder's registered aquaculture site, this form must be faxed to PIRSA Fisheries on (08) 8347 6150.

8. Prior to release into the registered aquaculture site, all abalone taken pursuant to this notice must be tagged so as to be clearly identified as wild broodstock.

9. The exemption holder must record the number of wild broodstock held pursuant to this notice in a register to be maintained at the registered aquaculture site, and must be made available for inspection by a PIRSA Fisheries Departmental Officer upon request.

10. The exemption holder must allow a PIRSA Fisheries Departmental Officer to accompany the exemption holder at any time during the exempted activity.

11. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must carry or have about or near his person a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Departmental Officer upon request.

12. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
