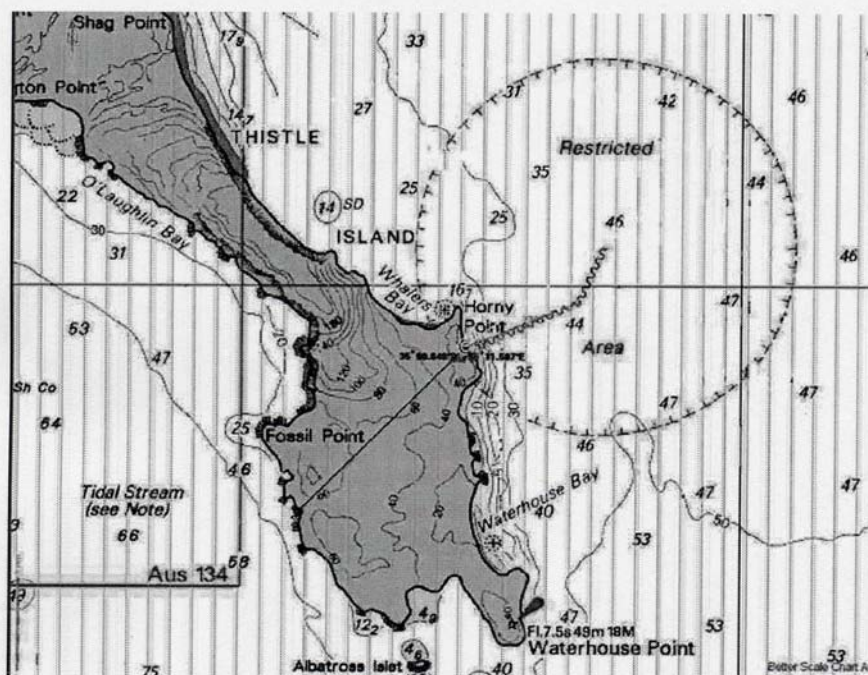


Figure One – Graphical representation of DPA R246
