DETERMINATION OF THE REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

NO. 1 OF 2017

Alternative Lease Vehicle for Commissioner Jennifer Nolan

Determination

The Remuneration Tribunal hereby makes the following Determination:

1. Having considered the request, and having regard to Commissioner Nolan's family circumstances, as submitted, the Tribunal makes this specific Determination to allow Commissioner Nolan to be supplied with a Suzuki Vitara S Turbo vehicle from Lease Plan (Fleet SA).
2. If the annual charge payable for a Suzuki Vitara S Turbo vehicle is greater than the annual charge payable by Executives for a Holden Commodore VF II Evoke Sedan, then Commissioner Nolan will be required to pay the difference between the amount determined from time to time by Fleet SA as the annual charge payable by Executives for a Holden Calais VF II Evoke Sedan, less the sum of \$758, and the amount determined from time to time by Fleet SA as the annual charge payable for a Suzuki Vitara S Turbo vehicle, less the sum of \$758.
3. All other conditions of Determination No. 9 of 2016, as amended from time to time, will continue to apply.

REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

REPORT RELATING TO DETERMINATION NO. 1 OF 2017

1. The Remuneration Tribunal ('the Tribunal') has received an application from Commissioner Jennifer Nolan of the Environment, Resources and Development Court to obtain a motor vehicle not listed in the schedule of Judicial Remuneration Vehicles attached to Determination No. 9 of 2016 ('the Conveyance Allowance Determination'). Commissioner Nolan's application is made on the basis of family circumstances.
2. Commissioner Nolan is entitled to a Conveyance Allowance, payable at the rate provided for by the Clause 2.1.3 of the Conveyance Allowance Determination. That amount of money is the higher of:
 - (a) \$15 298; and
 - (b) the amount determined from time to time by Fleet SA as the annual charge payable by Executives for a Holden Commodore VF II Evoke Sedan, less the sum of \$758.

3. The Conveyance Allowance is provided to meet the costs of obtaining a lease vehicle provided by Fleet SA. A judicial officer may select a vehicle from the list of judicial vehicles, as updated from time to time by Fleet SA.

4. A judicial officer, court officer or statutory officer is able to make a request to put their Conveyance Allowance towards the cost of leasing a vehicle which is not featured on the list of judicial vehicles, as published by Fleet SA. Those requests are provided for by Clause 3.2 of the Tribunal's current Conveyance Allowance Determination, which is set out as follows:

3.2 Alternative Vehicle

'An alternative vehicle may be supplied where appropriate on the basis of environmental sustainability, a medical disability or the family circumstances of a Judge, Court Officer or Statutory Officer, but only where approved by the Remuneration Tribunal. The annual charge for the use of the vehicle will be calculated on the same basis as the calculation made by Fleet SA for annual charges for use of motor vehicles by Executives.'

5. Having considered the request, and having regard to Commissioner Nolan's family circumstances, as submitted, the Tribunal has no objection to the proposal. The Tribunal therefore makes the accompanying Determination No. 1 of 2017 to allow Commissioner Nolan to be supplied with a Suzuki Vitara S Turbo vehicle from Lease Plan (Fleet SA).

DETERMINATION OF THE REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

NO. 2 OF 2017

Manager Family Violence List Allowance—Magistrates

Determination

The Remuneration Tribunal hereby makes the following Determination:

- (a) There shall be a Manager Family Violence List Allowance. The amount of the allowance shall be twenty one thousand, two hundred and ninety dollars (\$21 290) per annum.
- (b) The allowance shall be payable to the magistrate appointed to the position of Manager Family Violence List by the Chief Magistrate with the concurrence of the Attorney-General, to perform special duties, relating to family violence state-wide, for as long as that person continues in that position and performs the duties of the position.
- (c) Should the magistrate be appointed to that position on a part-time basis, the magistrate shall be entitled to payment of the allowance in accordance with paragraph (a) hereof, calculated on a pro-rata basis, as provided for by Section 13 (1b) of the Magistrates Act 1983.
- (d) This Determination shall come into force on and from 18 April 2017.

REMUNERATION TRIBUNAL

REPORT RELATING TO DETERMINATION NO. 2 OF 2017

Preamble

The Remuneration Tribunal ('the Tribunal') is given jurisdiction under Section 13 of the Remuneration Act 1990 ('the Act'), to determine the remuneration payable to the judiciary and the holders of public offices listed in that section of the Act.

Section 13 of the Magistrates Act 1983 confers jurisdiction on the Tribunal to determine additional remuneration for a magistrate, for the period that magistrate performs special duties, insofar as those duties are directed by the Chief Magistrate, with the concurrence of the Attorney-General.

On 13 December 2016, the Tribunal received an application from the Honourable Chief Magistrate Hribal ('the Chief Magistrate'), for determination of a special duties allowance payable to the magistrate who performs the duties of the newly established position of Manager Family Violence List.

Procedural History

On 21 December 2016, the Tribunal invited submissions from the Premier, the Attorney-General, the Judicial Remuneration Co-ordinating Committee ('JRCC') and the Chief Magistrate.

Submissions were received from the Chief Magistrate and the Crown Solicitor's Office ('CSO'), on behalf of the Premier. Both parties put to the Tribunal that the proposed allowance is appropriately payable in the circumstances.

A hearing was conducted by the Tribunal on 21 March 2017. The Chief Magistrate attended to make short oral argument in relation to her application and Carly Cooper of CSO attended on behalf of the Premier, to make oral submissions in the public interest.

Report

The position of Manager Family Violence List is a newly created position in relation to the office of magistrate, which has been created to address a steady increase in the volume of family violence matters being dealt with by the Magistrates Court, since the commencement of the Intervention Orders (Prevention of Abuse) Act 2009 on 9 December 2011.

Through written and oral submissions, the Tribunal has heard that the Magistrates Courts in most locations throughout South Australia now require a dedicated family violence list, which requires the responsible magistrate to consult with a multitude of Government and non-governmental agencies, Family and Federal Circuit Court and to co-ordinate user groups.

The responsible magistrate is also required to monitor and advise on legislative change in relation to family violence, and perform a leadership role in relation to family violence court procedures state-wide.

The Tribunal has given consideration to circumstances in which the allowance is proposed. The Tribunal has also given consideration to the level of the allowance proposed. The Tribunal is satisfied that the payment of the allowance is appropriate and that the level of the allowance submitted by the parties should be the amount of the allowance.

The Tribunal therefore makes the accompanying Determination No. 2 of 2017.

1. The coordinates in Schedule 1 are defined as degrees decimal minutes and based on the World Geodetic System 1984 (WGS 84).

2. No fishing activity may be undertaken between prescribed times of sunrise and sunset for Adelaide, (as published in the *South Australian Government Gazette*, pursuant to the requirements of the Proof of Sunrise and Sunset Act 1923) during the period specified in Schedule 2.

3. Fishing must cease:

- (a) in the area north of the fishing area known as the 'Mid/North Gulf' (as described on page 48 of the Management Plan for the South Australian Commercial Spencer Gulf Prawn Fishery October 2014), if the average catch per vessel, per night (based on the best information available to the committee at sea) drops below 500 kg.
- (b) in the area known as the 'Southern Gulf' area (as described on page 48 in the Management Plan for the South Australian Commercial Spencer Gulf Prawn Fishery October 2014), if the average catch per vessel, per night (based on the best information available to the committee at sea) drops below 350 kg for two nights.

4. Fishing must cease in an area in the Mid/North Gulf if the average prawn bucket count for all vessels (based on the best information available to the committee at sea) exceeds 240 prawns per 7 kg; or in an area in the Southern Gulf if the average bucket count for all vessels exceeds 260 prawns per 7 kg (based on the best information available to the committee at sea).

5. No fishing activity may occur without the authorisation of the Coordinator at Sea, Greg Palmer, or another Coordinator at Sea appointed by the Spencer Gulf and West Coast Prawn Fishermen's Association.

6. The authorisation of the Coordinator at Sea must be in writing, signed and record the day, date and permitted fishing area within the waters of Schedule 1 in the form of a notice sent to the fishing fleet or vary an earlier authorisation issued by the Coordinator at Sea.

7. The Coordinator at Sea must cause a copy of any authorisation for fishing activity or variation of the same, made under this notice to be emailed to the Prawn Fisheries Manager immediately after it is made.

8. The Coordinator at Sea must keep records of all authorisations issued pursuant to this notice.

Fishing Run for the West Coast Prawn Fishery

TAKE notice that pursuant to Regulation 9A of the Fisheries Management (Prawn Fisheries) Regulations 2006, the notice dated 21 March 2017 prohibiting fishing activities in the West Coast Prawn Fishery is hereby varied such that it will not be unlawful for a person fishing, pursuant to a West Coast Prawn Fishery licence to use prawn trawl nets in the areas specified in Schedule 1, during the period specified in Schedule 2, and under the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

1. Each licence holder must ensure that a representative sample of catch (a 'bucket count') is taken at least three times per night during the fishing activity.

2. Each 'bucket count' sample must be accurately weighed to 7 kg where possible and the total number of prawns contained in the bucket must be recorded on the daily catch and effort return.

3. Fishing must cease if one of the following limits is reached:

- (a) A total of 14 nights of fishing are completed;
- (b) the average catch per vessel, per night (for all three vessels) drops below 300 kg for two consecutive nights;
- (c) the average 'bucket count' exceeds 270 prawns per bucket on any single fishing night in the Ceduna area;
- (d) the average 'bucket count' for all three vessels exceeds 240 prawns per bucket on any single fishing night in the Coffin Bay area; or
- (e) the average 'bucket count' for all three vessels exceeds 250 prawns per bucket on any single fishing night in the Venus Bay area.

4. The fleet must nominate a licence holder to provide a daily update by telephone or SMS message to the Prawn Fishery Manager on 0477 396 367, to report the average prawn catch per vessel and the average prawn 'bucket count' information.

5. No fishing activity may be undertaken after the expiration of 30 minutes from the prescribed time of sunrise and no fishing activity may be undertaken before the prescribed time of sunset for Adelaide (as published in the *South Australian Government Gazette* pursuant to the requirements of the Proof of Sunrise and Sunset Act 1923) during the period specified in Schedule 2.

NATURAL RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 2004

*Notice of Authorisation to Take Water from the Gawler River
Prescribed Watercourse*

PURSUANT to Section 128 of the Natural Resources Management Act 2004 ('the Act'), I, Ian Hunter, Minister for Sustainability, Environment and Conservation ('the Minister') in the State of South Australia and the Minister to whom the Act is committed, hereby authorise the taking of water from the Gawler River Prescribed Watercourse (which is part of the Western Mount Lofty Ranges Prescribed Water Resources Area prescribed under the Act) within the areas specified in Schedule A, for the purposes set out in Schedule B and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule C

SCHEDULE A

Areas

Allotment 812 of Deposited Plan 76375 and Allotment 902 of Deposited Plan 85887, both within the Hundred of Mudla Wirra.

SCHEDULE B

Purpose

To supply water to municipal and agricultural users either directly or via managed aquifer recharge and recovery activities, through the operation of the Gawler Water Reuse Scheme.

SCHEDULE C

Conditions

1. Water may only be taken from the date of publication of this notice until 30 June 2018.

2. A maximum volume of 1 600 megalitres of surface water each water use year may be taken from the Gawler River Prescribed Watercourse during the period referred to in Condition 1 above.

3. Water must not be taken from the Gawler River Prescribed Watercourse when the rate of flow in the River at an approved point where water will be taken is less than 616 litres per second. The authorised water user must record flow rate immediately prior to each extraction of water from the Gawler River Prescribed Watercourse.

4. Structures associated with the purpose must be consistent with the objectives and principles of Section 8 (in particular Section 8.5) of the Western Mount Lofty Ranges Prescribed Water Resources Area Water Allocation Plan and standards and guidelines as approved by the Minister or his representative.

5. Monitoring of surface water flow, volumes or water quality associated with the purpose must be consistent with relevant standards and guidelines as approved by the Minister or his representative.

6. The authorised water user must not take water except through a meter(s), supplied, installed and maintained in accordance with the South Australian Licensed Water Use Meter Specification approved by the Minister as may be amended from time to time.

7. The authorised water user must take meter readings(s) from each meter through which water is taken pursuant to this authorisation. Meter reading(s) must be taken within the first 14 days of the date of this authorisation, during the first 14 calendar days of July and January each year and within the first 14 days of the expiry date of this authorisation.

8. The authorised water user must provide the data collected in accordance with Condition 3 and 7 to the Minister's representative in July of each water use year.

9. The water user must notify the Minister's representative immediately if a meter fails to measure or record any quantity of water taken under this authorisation or if there is any reason to suspect that a meter may be defective.

10. The water user must comply with the provisions applying to meters set out in Regulation 14 of the Natural Resources Management (Financial Provisions) Regulations 2005. It is an offence to contravene or fail to comply with those provisions.

For the purposes of this authorisation:

'Water use year' means a period of 12 months commencing on 1 July and ending 30 June the following calendar year.

Words used in this authorisation that are defined in the Act shall have the meanings as set out in the Act.

This authorisation will commence on the date below and will remain in effect until 30 June 2018 unless earlier varied or revoked.

In the case of an approval in relation to category B containers that the waste management arrangement must require the holder of the approval to provide specified super collectors with a declaration in the form determined by the Authority in relation to each sale of such containers by the holder of the approval as soon as practicable after the sale.

4. The holder of these approvals must ensure that if a sticker bearing the refund marking has been approved, and is applied to the container, then the sticker must not be placed on any portion of the opening mechanism or in any other place that would require complete or partial removal of the sticker before the contents may be consumed.
