FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

(hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder') c/o Marine Invertebrates Section, South Australian Museum, North Terrace, Adelaide, S.A. 5000, or his agents are exempt from the provisions of clause 63 D of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1984 to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2 from 25 February 2000 to 28 February 2000 inclusive.

The collection of aquatic organisms from South Australian coastal waters (including intertidal rocky reefs) adjacent to Port MacDonnell.

1. All specimens collected by the permit holder pursuant to this notice must not be sold.

2. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must notify PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

3. While engaging in the permitted activity, the permit holder must carry identification proving membership of the Malacological Society.

4. While engaging in the permitted activity, all agents assisting the permit holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 43

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 43 of the Fisheries Act 1982, it is hereby declared that it shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the class of fishing activity specified in Schedule 1, from the waters specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2001.

SCHEDULE 1

The act of taking or the act preparatory to or involved the taking of marine invertebrates.

SCHEDULE 2

The western shore of the Old Port Reach, Ethelton bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the low water mark on the eastern shore and Hart Street then to the western side of Grand Junction Road to the intersection with Causeway Road then to the northern side of Causeway Road to the intersection with Hart Street then to the eastern side of Hart Street back to the point of commencement.
