BUILDING WORK CONTRACTORS ACT 1995

Exemption

Take notice that, pursuant to Section 45 of the *Building Work Contractors Act 1995*, I, Emily Sims as a delegate for the Minister for Consumer and Business Affairs, do hereby exempt the licensee named in Schedule 1 from the application of Division 3 of Part 5 of the above Act in relation to domestic building work described in Schedule 2 and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 3

1. This exemption is limited to domestic building work personally performed by the licensee in relation to the building work described in Schedule 2.
2. This exemption does not apply to any domestic building work the licensee contracts to another building work contractor, for which that contractor is required by law to hold building indemnity insurance.
3. That the licensee does not transfer his interest in the land prior to five years from the date of completion of the building work the subject of this exemption, without the prior authorisation of Consumer and Business Services (CBS). Before giving such authorisation, CBS may require the licensee to take any reasonable steps to protect the future purchaser(s) of the property, including but not limited to:
 - Providing evidence that an adequate policy of building indemnity insurance is in force to cover the balance of the five-year period from the date of completion of the building work the subject of this exemption;
 - Providing evidence of an independent expert inspection of the building work the subject of this exemption;
 - Making an independent expert report available to prospective purchasers of the property;
 - Giving prospective purchasers of the property notice of the absence of a policy of building indemnity insurance.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007

SECTION 115

Ministerial Exemption ME9903362

Take notice that pursuant to Section 115 of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007*, Ms Aleisha Casson of the Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board, 2 Sturt Reserve Road, Murray Bridge SA 5253 (the 'exemption holder') and her nominated agents, are exempt from Section 71(1) and 71(2) of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* and Regulation 5 and Clauses 40 and 44 of Schedule 6 of the *Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2017* but only insofar as the exemption holder or nominated agents may engage in activities of the Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board supporting the monitoring and collection of native fish in the South Australian River Murray wetlands from the waters described in Schedule 1, using the gear specified in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3, from 13 April 2025 until 12 April 2026, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

Wetlands within the SA Murray-Darling Basin between the South Australian border and the Murray Mouth, including the fringing wetlands of Lakes Alexandrina and Albert and the Murray Mouth, and sites listed under Ministerial permit MP0268 and MP0269. Also included is the site of North Purnong wetland listed under Ministerial permit MP0271.

SCHEDULE 2

- 18 x fyke nets (6mm mesh, 7m wing)
- 18 x fyke nets (4mm mesh, 7m and/or 4m wing)
- 6 x double wing fyke nets (4mm mesh, 5m wings)
- 1 x seine net (4mm mesh, 5m length)
- 1 x dip net
- 10 x Shrimp traps

SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holder will be deemed responsible for the conduct of all persons undertaking the exempted activities under this notice. Any person conducting activities under this exemption must be provided with a copy of this notice, which they must have signed as an indication that they have read and understood the conditions under it.
2. During the exempted activity a maximum of 5,000 Southern Pygmy Perch (*Nannoperca australis*), a maximum of 5,000 Yarra Pygmy Perch (*Nannoperca obscura*), a maximum of 5,000 Southern Purple-Spotted Gudgeon (*Mogurnda adspersa*), a maximum of 30,000 Murray Hardyhead (*Craterocephalus fluvialtilis*) and a maximum of 300 adult or juvenile European Carp (*Cyprinus carpio*) may be retained.
3. Other than the fish listed at condition 2 that may be retained, all native fish taken pursuant to the exempted activity must be returned to the water in the locations where they were captured.
4. Any specimens collected or retained by the exemption holder must be translocated in accordance with the conditions of Ministerial permit MP0268 or MP0271 or be held in accordance with MP0269 or MP0271 for scientific and research purposes only and must not be sold.
5. All non-native species of fish, except for listed species, caught during the exempted activity must be destroyed and disposed of appropriately.

7. The exemption holder must notify the Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 at least 2 hours prior to conducting any exempted activities and answer a series of questions about the exempted activity. The exemption holder will need to have a copy of the exemption notice at the time of making the call and be able to provide information about the area and time of the exempted activity, the vehicles and boats involved, the number of agents undertaking the exempted activity and other related questions.
8. The exemption holder must provide a written report detailing the outcomes of the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice to PIRSA, Fisheries and Aquaculture, (PIRSA.Ministerialexemptionsandpermits@sa.gov.au) upon completion, giving the following details:
 - the date, soak time and location of collection;
 - the number of nets or traps used;
 - the description of all species collected;
 - the number of each species collected; and
 - any other relevant information.
9. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a Fisheries Officer if requested.
10. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

This notice does not purport to override the provisions or operation of any other Act including but not limited to the *River Murray Act 2003*.

Motor Vehicles (Approval of Motor Bikes and Motor Trikes) Notice 2025 No 1

under the *Motor Vehicles Act 1959*

1—Short title

This notice may be cited as the *Motor Vehicles (Approval of Motor Bikes and Motor Trikes) Notice 2025*.

2—Commencement

This notice will come into operation on the date of publication in this Gazette.

3—Approved motor bikes and motor trikes

For the purposes of Schedules 2 and 3 of the *Motor Vehicles Regulations 2010* and the transitional provisions of the *Motor Vehicles Variation Regulations 2005* (No 233 of 2005), the motor bikes and motor trikes specified in Schedule 1 are approved.

Schedule 1—Approved motor bikes and motor trikes

The following are approved:

- All motor bikes and motor trikes built before December 1960 with an engine capacity not exceeding 660ml
- All motor bikes and motor trikes with an engine capacity not exceeding 260 milliliters and a power to weight ratio not exceeding 150 kilowatts per tonne, except the following:
 - Suzuki RGV250
 - Kawasaki KR250 (KR-1 and KR1s models)
 - Honda NSR250
 - Yamaha TZR250
 - Aprilia RS250
- All motor bikes and motor trikes with electric powered engines, with a power output not in excess of 25kw

4—Approved foreign licences—Section 79A(4)(a)(ii)

For the purposes of Section 79A(4)(a)(ii) of the *Motor Vehicles Act 1959*:

- (a) a foreign licence of a country listed in Schedule 1 is approved if the applicant is applying for a licence of class “C”, “R” or “R-D”; and
- (b) a foreign licence of New Zealand authorising the holder to drive a vehicle other than a car or motorcycle is approved if the applicant is applying for any class of licence.

For the purposes of Section 79A(4)(a)(ii) of the *Motor Vehicles Act 1959* foreign licences issued by the countries listed in Schedule 2 where the licence holder is 25 years of age or older are no longer approved.

*Commentary to the Statement of the Amounts Credited to and Issued from the Consolidated Account
for the Quarters Ended 30 September 2024 and 30 September 2023*

Receipts

Taxation

Gambling tax receipts in the September quarter 2024 were lower than the corresponding prior year period mainly due to the timing of payments of gaming machine collections into the consolidated account, partially offset by higher receipts from the timing of payments from the Lotteries Commission.

Land tax receipts in the September quarter 2024 were broadly in line with the corresponding prior year period.

Payroll tax receipts in the September quarter 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year period primarily reflecting growth in taxable payrolls.

Stamp duty receipts in the September quarter 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year period largely due to higher conveyance duty receipts from the transfer of properties.

Royalties

Royalty receipts for the September quarter 2024 were lower than the corresponding prior year period mainly due to lower petroleum production.

Fees and Charges

Fees and Charges in the September quarter 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year period due to the timing of the collection of regulatory fees from the Department of Trade and Investment, partially offset by the timing of collection of infringement notices from South Australian Police.

Commonwealth—General Purpose Payments

Growth in general purpose grant receipts in 2024-25 compared to 2023-24 is not indicative of underlying movements in Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue. This is because monthly grants are paid according to a payment schedule prepared by the Commonwealth Government rather than actual emerging monthly GST collections.

Based on the growth in the national GST pool and population estimates as well as South Australia's relativity in 2024-25, the Commonwealth Government estimated in its 2024-25 Budget that South Australia's GST entitlement grant will increase by 2.3 per cent in 2024-25.

Commonwealth—Specific Purpose Payments

Specific Purpose Payments received in the September quarter 2024 were broadly in line with the corresponding prior year period.

Commonwealth—National Partnership Payments

National Partnership Payments received in the September quarter 2024 were broadly in line with the corresponding prior year period.

Other Receipts

Other receipts in the September quarter 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year period mainly due to higher interest on investments. This is due to higher interest rates applied on the Treasurer's deposits placed with the South Australian Government Financing Authority.

Payments

Payments were made pursuant to the *Appropriation Act 2024* and also in accordance with other Acts for which specific appropriation has been authorised. The timing of the payments is based on agreed agency drawdown schedules and may change from period to period based on specific agency requirements.

All appropriations were paid within approved limits established under the various Acts.

Note

The following points should be considered when reviewing the quarterly statement of Consolidated Account transactions:

- Unlike the State Budget which comprises transactions on an accrual basis, the information reflected in the quarterly statement is limited to cash transactions.
- The Consolidated Account does not capture all the transactions undertaken by the general government sector. In particular, it does not record receipts to, and payments from, Agency deposit and special deposit accounts.

The timing of receipts and payments can fluctuate within a financial year and between financial years. As a result, apparently large movements between quarters or years may only be due to changes in the timing of receipts and payments and therefore may not have consequences for the underlying budget position

Receipts

Taxation

Gambling tax receipts in the December quarter 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year period mainly due to higher gaming machine collections, partially offset by lower receipts from the timing of payments from the Lotteries Commission. Gambling tax receipts in the six months ended December 2024 were lower than the corresponding prior year period mainly due to the timing of payments from gaming machine collections.

Land tax receipts in the December quarter 2024 and six months ended December 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year periods mainly due to higher private land tax collections reflecting growth in taxable site values.

Payroll tax receipts in the December quarter 2024 and six months ended 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year periods primarily reflecting growth in taxable payrolls.

Stamp duty receipts in the December quarter 2024 and six months ended 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year periods largely due to higher conveyance duty receipts from the transfer of properties and higher insurance duty reflecting growth in general insurance premiums.

Royalties

Royalty receipts for the December quarter 2024 were broadly in line with the corresponding prior year period. Royalty receipts in the six months ended December 2024 were lower than the corresponding prior year period mainly due to lower royalty collections from minerals reflecting the timing of payments.

Fees and Charges

Fees and Charges in the December quarter 2024 and six months ended 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year periods largely due to the timing of fee collections.

Commonwealth—General Purpose Payments

Growth in general purpose grant receipts in 2024-25 compared to 2023-24 is not indicative of underlying movements in Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue. This is because monthly grants are paid according to a payment Schedule prepared by the Commonwealth Government rather than actual emerging monthly GST collections.

Based on the growth in the national GST pool and population estimates as well as South Australia's relativity in 2024-25, the Commonwealth Government estimated in its 2024-25 Mid-Year Economic and Fiscal Outlook that South Australia's GST entitlement grant will increase by 5.7 per cent in 2024-25.

Commonwealth—Specific Purpose Payments

Specific Purpose Payments received in the December quarter 2024 and six months ended December 2024 were broadly in line with the corresponding prior year periods.

Commonwealth—National Partnership Payments

National Partnership Payments received in the December quarter 2024 and six months ended December 2024 were lower than the corresponding prior year periods reflecting the timing of payments under the Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements.

Other Receipts

Other receipts in the December quarter 2024 and six months ended 2024 were higher than the corresponding prior year period mainly due to higher interest on investments. This is due to higher interest rates applied on the Treasurer's deposits placed with the South Australian Government Financing Authority.

Payments

Payments were made pursuant to the *Appropriation Act 2024* and also in accordance with other Acts for which specific appropriation has been authorised. The timing of the payments is based on agreed agency drawdown Schedules and may change from period to period based on specific agency requirements.

All appropriations were paid within approved limits established under the various Acts.

Note

The following points should be considered when reviewing the quarterly statement of Consolidated Account transactions:

- Unlike the State Budget which comprises transactions on an accrual basis, the information reflected in the quarterly statement is limited to cash transactions.
- The Consolidated Account does not capture all the transactions undertaken by the general government sector. In particular, it does not record receipts to, and payments from, Agency deposit and special deposit accounts.

The timing of receipts and payments can fluctuate within a financial year and between financial years. As a result, apparently large movements between quarters or years may only be due to changes in the timing of receipts and payments and therefore may not have consequences for the underlying budget position.

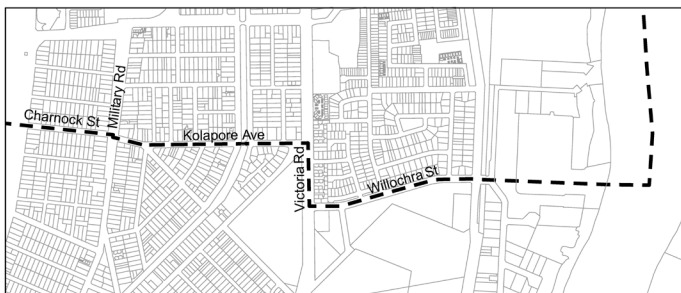

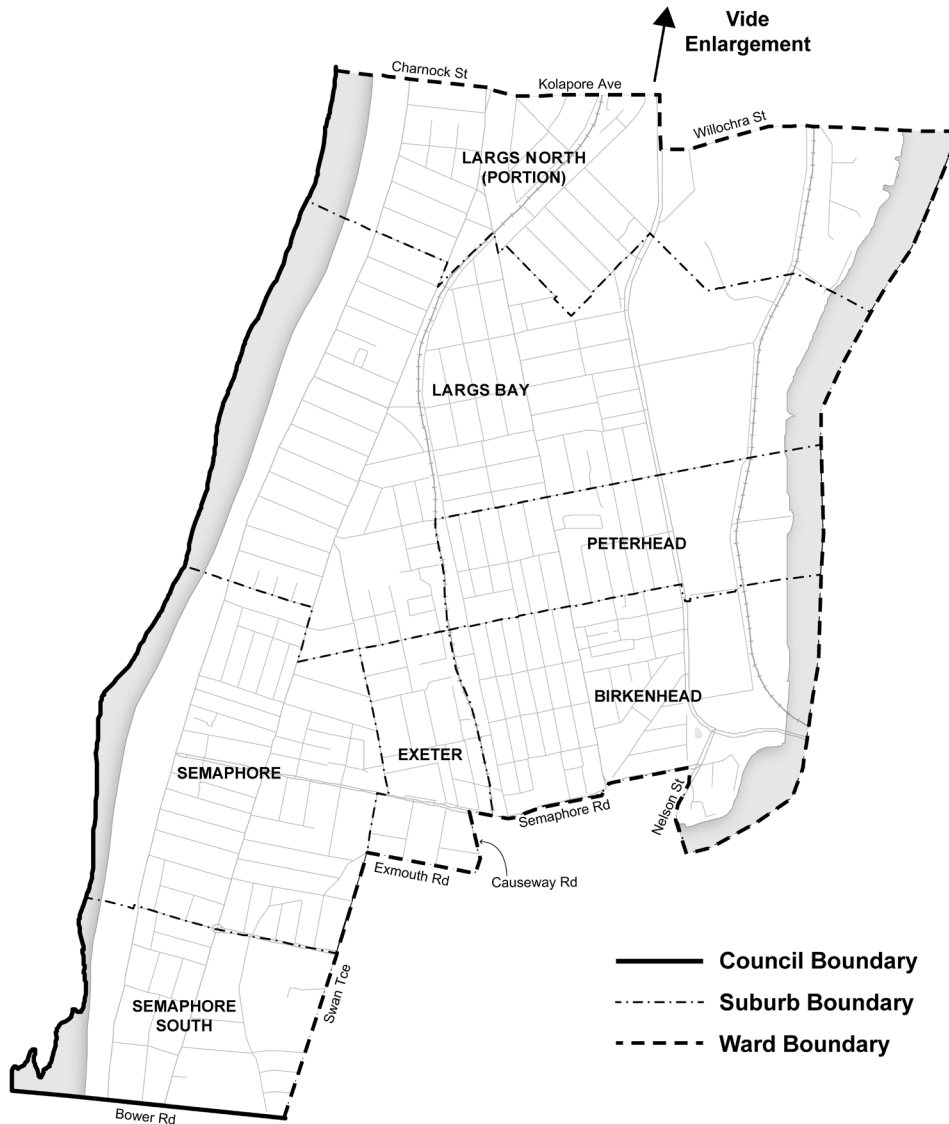
