Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Planning, Development and Infrastructure (General)* (Essential Infrastructure and State Agency Development) Amendment Regulations 2025.

2—Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which they are made.

Part 2—Amendment of *Planning, Development and Infrastructure* (General) Regulations 2017

3—Insertion of regulation 3DA

After regulation 3D insert:

3DA—Definition of essential infrastructure

- (1) The following are within the ambit of the definition of *essential infrastructure* in section 3(1) of the Act:
 - (a) data centres;

- (b) aged care facilities.
- (2) In this regulation—

aged care facility means a facility that provides supported accommodation for older people, and includes a retirement village that is co-located with an aged care facility;

retirement village has the same meaning as in the Retirement Villages Act 2016;

supported accommodation has the same meaning as in the Planning and Design Code.

4—Amendment of regulation 104A—Essential infrastructure—alternative assessment process

Regulation 104A—after subsection (1) insert:

(1a) For the purposes of section 130(1) of the Act, sewerage infrastructure that is, or is to be used, for the treatment of sewage is prescribed.

5—Amendment of regulation 107—General scheme

Regulation 107(2)—after paragraph (c) insert:

and

- (d) if the development is for the purposes of a data centre—
 - (i) advice from the South Australian Water Corporation that there is sufficient water supply to meet the requirements of the proposed data centre; and
 - (ii) a certificate from the Technical Regulator certifying that the proposed data centre complies with the requirements of the Technical Regulator in relation to the reliability, security and stability of the State's power system.

6—Amendment of Schedule 6—Relevant authority—Commission

Schedule 6—after clause 9 insert:

9A—Data centres

Development for the purposes of a data centre.

7—Amendment of Schedule 8—Plans

Schedule 8—after clause 15 insert:

15A—Data centres

An application in respect of a proposed development for which the Commission is the relevant authority in accordance with Schedule 6 clause 9A must be accompanied by—

(a) advice from the South Australian Water Corporation that there is sufficient water supply to meet the requirements of the proposed data centre; and

(b) a certificate from the Technical Regulator certifying that the proposed data centre complies with the requirements of the Technical Regulator in relation to the reliability, security and stability of the State's power system.

8—Amendment of Schedule 13—State agency development exempt from approval

- (1) Schedule 13, clause 2(1)(b)(ii) and (iii)—delete subparagraphs (ii) and (iii) and substitute:
 - (ii) the undertaking or installation of works, infrastructure or equipment (including in relation to a building), if only of a local nature, for the purposes of the supply, disposal or treatment of water or waste water (other than a desalination plant, wastewater treatment plant or wastewater lagoon); or
 - (iii) the undertaking or installation of works, infrastructure or equipment that is ancillary to works, infrastructure or equipment referred to in subparagraph (ii); or
- (2) Schedule 13, clause 2(1)—delete paragraph (sa) and substitute:
 - (sa) the construction, reconstruction, alteration of, or addition to, an amenities facility with a floor area of 50 m² or less;
- (3) Schedule 13, clause 2(1)(w)—after subparagraph (ii) insert:
 - (iia) that—
 - (A) is undertaken to allow for the provision of water supply or sewerage services to land; and
 - (B) is undertaken by or with the written authority of the South Australian Water Corporation; or
- (4) Schedule 13, clause 2—after subclause (5) insert:
 - (6) For the purposes of subclause (1)(b)(ii) and (iii), development comprising the undertaking or installation of works, infrastructure or equipment is of a local nature if the works, infrastructure or equipment are for the purposes of servicing a township or suburb and is not inconsistent or out of character with the size or location of other works, infrastructure or equipment of that kind in that township or suburb.

BUILDING WORK CONTRACTORS ACT 1995

Exemption

Take notice that, pursuant to Section 45 of the *Building Work Contractors Act 1995*, I, Brett Humphrey as a delegate for the Minister for Consumer and Business Affairs, do hereby exempt the licensee named in Schedule 1 from the application of Division 3 of Part 5 of the above Act in relation to domestic building work described in Schedule 2 and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

That the licensee does not transfer his interest in the land prior to five years from the date of completion of the building work the subject of this exemption, without the prior authorisation of Consumer and Business Services (CBS). Before giving such authorisation, CBS may require the licensee to take any reasonable steps to protect the future purchaser(s) of the property, including but not limited to:
 - Providing evidence that an adequate policy of building indemnity insurance is in force to cover the balance of the five-year period from the date of completion of the building work the subject of this exemption;
 - · Providing evidence of an independent expert inspection of the building work the subject of this exemption;
 - Making an independent expert report available to prospective purchasers of the property;
 - Giving prospective purchasers of the property notice of the absence of a policy of building indemnity insurance.

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT (PRAWN FISHERIES) REGULATIONS 2017

Gear Trial for the West Coast, Spencer Gulf and Gulf St Vincent Prawn Fisheries

Take notice that pursuant to Regulation 10 of the Fisheries Management (Prawn Fisheries) Regulations 2017, the holder of a prawn fishery licence issued pursuant to the Fisheries Management (Prawn Fisheries) Regulations 2017 or their registered master, are exempt from any notice made under Regulation 10 of the Fisheries Management (Prawn Fisheries) Regulations 2017 prohibiting the taking of Western King Prawns, *Melicertus latisulcatus*, in the waters specified in Schedule 1, in that they shall not be guilty of an offence when using prawn trawl nets in accordance with the conditions of their licence for the purpose of trialling fishing gear (the 'exempted activity') subject to the conditions contained in Schedule 2.

- 7. The licence holder or their master must contact the PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522, not less than one hour prior to the boat returning to port and provide the following information;
 - · A description of the boat used including the registration number marked on that boat; and
 - The estimated time of return to port.
- 8. The licence holder and their registered master must not contravene or fail to comply with *Fisheries Management Act 2007* (the Act), or any other Regulations made under that Act except whereby specifically exempted by this notice.

- 8. All fyke nets left unattended must be clearly marked with name and Ministerial exemption number on a tag if set close to shore or on a 2 L buoy if set away from shore.
- 9. At least 1 hour before conducting activities under this exemption, the exemption holder or nominated agent must contact the Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 and answer a series of questions about the exempted activity. The caller will need to have a copy of this notice in their possession at the time of making the call and be able to provide information about the area and time of the exempted activity, the vehicles and/or boats involved, the number of persons assisting with undertaking the exempted activity and other related questions.
- 10. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the activities carried out pursuant to this notice to the Executive Director, Fisheries and Aquaculture (GPO Box 1625, Adelaide SA 5001) within 30 days of the expiry of this exemption that includes the following details:
 - · date and location of sampling;
 - · gear used;
 - number and description of all species collected;
 - · any interactions with protected species; and
 - other information regarding size, breeding or anything deemed relevant or of interest that is able to be volunteered.

- 11. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this exemption and the exemption must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Officer if requested.




