Part 1—Preliminary

1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Police (Police Security Officers) Amendment Regulations 2026*.

2—Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which they are made.

- (h) conveying and guarding exhibit property;
- (i) recovering stolen and abandoned vehicles;
- (j) undertaking related duties by order of another person possessing the requisite authority.

STATE GOVERNMENT INSTRUMENTS

FISHERIES MANAGEMENT ACT 2007

SECTION 115

Ministerial Exemption ME9903408

Take notice that pursuant to Section 115 of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* (the Act), Dr Sylvia Zukowski of Nature Glenelg Trust (ACN: 153 577 907), 16 Anglesea Road, Victor Harbor SA 5211 (the 'exemption holder') and her nominated agents, are exempt from Sections 70, 71(1) and 71(2) of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* and Clauses 40, 42, 47 and 74 of Schedule 6 of the *Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2017* but only insofar as they may use the fishing gear specified in Schedule 1, in the waters specified in Schedule 2 to collect fish species listed, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3, from 20 January 2026 until 19 January 2027, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

- 24 x Fyke nets (maximum wingspan of 7m, minimum mesh size of 2mm)
- 5 x Seine nets (maximum length of 25m, minimum mesh size of 3mm)
- 10 x Soft-release enclosures (maximum dimension of 1m², minimum mesh size of 4mm)
- 2 x Dip Nets (maximum 400mm gape, minimum 3mm mesh)

SCHEDULE 2

Wetlands within the SA Murray-Darling Basin between the South Australian border and the Murray Mouth, including the fringing wetlands of Lakes Alexandrina and Lake Albert and the Murray Mouth, and waters within the Western and Eastern Mount Lofty Region, and the Ewan and Piccaninnie Ponds System, and sites listed under Ministerial Permit MP0257 and MP0258.

SCHEDULE 3

1. The exemption holder will be deemed responsible for the conduct of all persons conducting the activities under this notice. Any person conducting activities as an agent under this exemption must be provided with a copy of this notice, which they must sign as an indication that they have read and understand the conditions of the exemption.
2. The maximum number of combined captured juvenile and adult fish species to be retained per a site.
 - 1000 x Southern Purple-spotted Gudgeon (*Mogurnda adspersa*).
 - 100 x Freshwater Catfish (*Tandanus tandanus*).
 - 50 x River Blackfish (*Gadopsis marmoratus*).
 - 10,000 x Southern Pygmy Perch (*Nannoperca australis*).
 - 100 x Variegated Pygmy Perch (*Nannoperca variegata*).
 - 10,000 x Olive Perchlet (*Ambassis agassizii*).
 - 10,000 x Yarra Pygmy Perch (*Nannoperca obscura*).
 - 500 x Little Galaxias (*Galaxiella toourtkoourt*).
 - 10,000 x Murray Hardyhead (*Craterocephalus fluviatilis*).
3. Other than the fish specified in condition 2 that may be collected under this exemption all native fish taken pursuant to the exempted activity must be returned to the water in the locations where they were captured.
4. Any specimens collected and retained by the exemption holder must be translocated in accordance with the conditions of Ministerial permit MP0258 or be held in accordance with MP0257 for translocation purposes only and must not be sold.
5. Any noxious fish collected during the exempted activity must not be returned to the water and must be destroyed and disposed of appropriately.
6. The following persons are authorised to act as agents under this Ministerial exemption (ME9903408):
 - Dr Nick Whiterod
 - Matt Jacobs
 - Cory Young
 - Ida Moore
7. Before conducting the exempted activity, the exemption holder must contact the Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 and answer a series of questions about the exempted activity and be able to provide information about the area and time of the exempted activity, the vehicles and/or boats involved, the number of agents undertaking the exempted activity and other related issues.
8. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the outcomes of the research and the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice to the Executive Director PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture, (GPO Box 1625, Adelaide SA 5001) within 2 weeks of completion of the last activity to occur under this notice or within 2 weeks of the expiry of this notice, whichever occurs first, giving the following details:
 - the date and location of sampling;
 - the number of and types of nets used;
 - the description of all species collected (fish, invertebrates, turtles) for purposes of identification;
 - the number of each species collected.
9. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder or a person acting as their agent must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a Fisheries Officer if requested.
10. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* or any Regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice or any other notice issued under that Act.

This notice does not purport to override the provisions or operation of any other Act including, but not limited to, the *River Murray Act 2003*. The exemption holder and their agents must comply with any relevant regulations, permits, requirements and directions from the Department for Environment and Water when undertaking activities within the River Murray.



This Notice is given in accordance with the powers delegated to me, Michael Francis, Chief Executive Officer, by the Board of the Return to Work Corporation of South Australia ('the Corporation') under an Instrument of Delegations dated 12 June 2025.

Section 17A of the *Return to Work Act 2014* ('the Act') provides that a worker's employer or the Corporation must not be present while a worker is:

- (a) being physically or clinically examined, or treated, by a health practitioner; or
- (b) undergoing any diagnostic examination or test required for the purposes of the worker's treatment by a health practitioner

unless the worker gives written agreement to their presence in the designated form.

Section 4(15) of the Act provides that a reference in a provision of the Act to a designated form is a reference to a form designated for the purposes of that provision by the Corporation from time to time by notice in the Gazette.

PRIVACY AT MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

A guide for injured workers

Privacy at medical appointments

New laws commenced on 1 December 2024 which protect the privacy of injured workers during medical treatment and examinations.

Can my employer or claims agent be present for medical examinations?

No, unless you provide written consent.

Your employer (including self-insured/Crown employers, their Return to Work Coordinators, or third parties acting on their behalf) or ReturnToWorkSA (including its claims agents EML and Gallagher Bassett), must not be present while you are being examined or treated by a health practitioner unless you have provided written consent.

This includes whilst you are undertaking any medical tests you may need.

Can I choose to have my employer or claims agent in the room?

Yes, if you provide consent.

You are under no obligation to provide consent. However, if you choose to allow them to be present, you must complete and sign the required consent form.

Some workers like to have their employer or claims agent with them during an appointment with the health practitioner. For example, they might want their Return to Work Coordinator at a hand therapy session to discuss work capacity and return-to-work options during treatment. [This requires a signed consent form.](#)

What if we are discussing my return to work?

Your employer (including any agent) or ReturnToWorkSA (including EML and Gallagher Bassett) can be present before or after the examination or treatment part of your medical appointment. They can also attend a case conference involving you and your health practitioner(s) to discuss your recovery and return to work. This can occur without the completion of the written consent form.

Who are the health practitioners this applies to?

You may have multiple health practitioners supporting you throughout your recovery.

The definition of a health practitioner is, a person who is registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (other than a student) and is:

- a medical practitioner
- a dentist
- a psychologist
- an optician
- a physiotherapist
- a chiropractor
- a podiatrist
- an occupational therapist, or
- an osteopath.

A speech pathologist who is registered by the Speech Pathology Association of Australia Limited is also defined as a health practitioner.

How is this different to the Medical Authority I completed?

At the start of your claim, you may sign an 'Authority to Release Medical Information' form which allows your claims manager, employer and health practitioner to share information relevant to your work injury or your claim so that they can best support your recovery and return to work.

This consent form is different to the 'Authority to Release Medical Information'. This consent form is only to allow your employer (including third party agents acting on its behalf) or ReturnToWorkSA (including its claims agents EML and Gallagher Bassett) to be present during your medical examination, testing or treatment.

What happens if I don't sign this form?

You do not have to sign this form. Your claim will not be affected.

Can I change my mind?

Yes, you can change your mind at any time even if you have signed the consent form. You can:

- refuse entry into the appointment at the time
- alert your health practitioner of your change in consent, or
- speak with your Return to Work Coordinator, employer or Claims Manager (verbally or in writing).

If you feel your wishes regarding consent have not been appropriately managed, help is available. You should raise your concern directly with the person or organisation that is managing your claim in the first instance, but if you remain unhappy, you can call 13 18 55 for ReturnToWorkSA assistance, or speak with your union or legal representative.

Employer or ReturnToWorkSA attendance at medical appointments – Notice

This Notice clarifies requirements relating to worker choice of health practitioners and employer and/or ReturnToWorkSA attendance at medical appointments.

Legislation

Section 17A of the *Return to Work Act 2014* provides that a worker's employer (including any agent) or ReturnToWorkSA (including EML and Gallagher Bassett) must not be present whilst the worker is:

- being physically or clinically examined, or treated, by a health practitioner; or
- undergoing any diagnostic examination or test for the purposes of their treatment by a health practitioner,

unless the worker has provided their written agreement in the prescribed form to their employer and/or ReturnToWorkSA being present during the examination, treatment or testing.

Health practitioners

The definition of a health practitioner is, a person who is registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (other than a student) and is:

- a medical practitioner
- a dentist
- a psychologist
- an optician
- a physiotherapist
- a chiropractor
- a podiatrist
- an occupational therapist, or
- an osteopath.

A speech pathologist who is registered by the Speech Pathology Association of Australia Limited is also defined as a health practitioner.

Your rights

When you require treatment for a work injury, you have the right to choose which individual health practitioners you receive treatment from.

Whilst an employer or ReturnToWorkSA may recommend a health practitioner to you, you have the right to choose your own treatment provider.

You have the right to be physically or clinically examined or treated by a health practitioner or undergo any diagnostic examination or test, without your employer (including its Return to Work Coordinator or third party agents acting on its behalf) or ReturnToWorkSA (including its claims agents EML and Gallagher Bassett) being present.

You have the right to refuse a request from your employer or ReturnToWorkSA to be present when you are being physically or clinically examined or treated by a health practitioner, or undergoing any diagnostic examination or test.

There is no legal requirement for your employer or ReturnToWorkSA to be present whilst you are being examined or treated by a health practitioner.

By interacting with your treating health practitioners, your employer, ReturnToWorkSA and your treating health practitioner(s) are best placed to support to you to successfully recover from your injury and make a safe return to work.

There are alternative arrangements available for your employer and ReturnToWorkSA to engage with your treating health practitioners without the need to be present at your medical appointments (i.e. medical case conferences held after medical appointments either in person or by teleconference).

Privacy & confidentiality

Information about your physical and mental condition and personal circumstances or affairs is confidential and protected from disclosure by sections 185 and 186 of the *Return to Work Act 2014*. This includes all information about your claim and injuries provided by you or your treating health practitioners to your employer and ReturnToWorkSA.

Application of Local Government Land By-law 2025, Dogs By-law 2025 and Cats By-law 2025

Pursuant to Section 246(4a) of the *Local Government Act 1999* (the **Act**), notice is hereby given that at its meeting on 16 December 2025 and pursuant to the power contained in Section 246(3)(e) of the Act, the City of Mount Gambier (the **Council**) made resolutions to apply certain provisions of the *Local Government Land By-law No. 2 of 2025* (the **Land By-law**) and *Dogs By-law No. 5 of 2025* (the **Dogs By-law**) to land in the Council's area.

More specifically, the Council has resolved:

- for the purposes of Clause 7.2 of the Land By-law, a fee as described in the Council's Schedule of Fees and Charges from time to time will apply to the portion of Local Government land located at 26 Chute Street, Mount Gambier which comprises the fenced area of Engelbrecht Cave;
- for the purposes of Clause 9.11.2.1 of the Land By-law, that a boat may be launched and retrieved without permission from the Council from or on to the boat ramps located at Section 591, Hundred of Blanche (Valley Lake, Lot 100, Bay Road, Mount Gambier) in accordance with any conditions specified on a sign displayed on or in the vicinity of the boat ramp;
- for the purposes of Clause 9.15.2.2 of the Land By-law, that the portions of the Blue Lake Caravan Park identified in the plan contained in Annexure A of the By-law Review report (Item 19.6) accompanying the Council Agenda of 16 December 2025 (the **Report**) are designated camping areas where camping may occur without the permission of the Council in accordance with any conditions specified on a sign displayed on or in the vicinity of the area;
- for the purposes of Clause 9.26.5 of the Land By-law, that golf may be played or practised without permission of the Council on the Local Government land comprising the portions of The Blue Lake Golf Club identified in the plan contained in **Annexure A** of the Report in accordance with any conditions specified on a sign displayed on or in the vicinity of that land;
- for the purposes of Clause 9.1 of the Dogs By-law, the Local Government land or public places listed below and as shown on the maps identified in **Annexure A** of the Report, are locations where dogs are required to be on-leash at all times:
 - Mount Gambier Rail Trail;
 - Engelbrecht Cave, located at 26 Chute Street, Mount Gambier;
 - Vansittart Park, located at 104 Commercial Street West, Mount Gambier (and not extending to the playground areas where dogs are prohibited under Clause 10.1 of the By-law);
 - Lady Nelson Reserve, located at 35 Jubilee Highway East, Mount Gambier;
 - Valley Lake/Ketla Malpi, located at Allotment 100 Bay Road, Mount Gambier, (and not extending to the playground areas where dogs are prohibited under Clause 10.1 of the By-law);
 - Olympic Park, located at 7 Margaret Street, Mount Gambier;
 - Cave Gardens/Thugi, located at 38 Commercial Street East, Mount Gambier; and
 - Umpherston Sinkhole/Balumbul, located at 160 Jubilee Highway East, Mount Gambier.
- For the purposes of Clause 10.2 of the Dogs By-law, a person is prohibited from taking a dog into, or allowing a dog to remain, at the following locations:
 - all playing surfaces at Blue Lake Sports Park, located at 200 Jubilee Highway East, Mount Gambier and as shown on the maps identified in **Annexure A** of the Report; and
 - the inside of all buildings owned by or containing facilities operated by the Council.

 - 5.4 **Waste Management By-law** means the *Waste Management By-law of 2025* made by the Council on 4 August 2025 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 14 August 2025; and

PART 2 – AMENDMENT TO BY-LAWS

6. **Amendment to LGL By-law**
As and from the date that this By-law takes effect, subclause 9.5.1 of the LGL By-law is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 9.5.1 *Cause or allow an animal to stray onto, move over, graze or be left unattended except on any Local Government land to which the Council has resolved this clause applies and provided that the animal or animals are under effective control.*
7. **Amendment to Waste Management By-law**
As and from the date that this By-law takes effect, subclause 10.8 of the LGL By-law is deleted and substituted with the following:
 - 10.8 **Removal of container**
not, without a reasonable excuse (as determined by an authorised person acting reasonably), fail to remove all waste containers from the road on the same day as the collection of waste has occurred;
