## 1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Preventive Health SA Regulations 2026*.

## 2—Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which they are made.

## 3—Interpretation

In these regulations—

*Act* means the *Preventive Health SA Act 2024*.

## 4—Code of conduct for members of Preventive Health SA Council

Pursuant to section 21(3) of the Act, the code of conduct to be observed by members of the Council is set out in Schedule 1.

## **Schedule 1—Code of conduct**

### **Part 1—Preliminary**

#### **1—Interpretation**

In this code—

*member* means a member of the Council.

#### **2—Objects of code of conduct**

The objects of this code of conduct are—

- (a) to establish standards of conduct, behaviour and professionalism to be observed by members; and
- (b) to outline processes to ensure the integrity of, and public confidence in, the Council is promoted and maintained; and
- (c) to ensure that the performance of the functions of the Council is not affected by pecuniary or personal interests or associations of members; and
- (d) to promote ethical conduct and prevent unethical conduct.

**Note—**

The duties of advisory body members under Part 2 Division 2 of the *Public Sector (Honesty and Accountability) Act 1995* apply to members of the Council.

#### **3—Publication of code of conduct**

The Chief Executive must publish a copy of this code of conduct on a website determined by the Chief Executive.

### **Part 2—General rules of conduct**

#### **4—Knowledge of Act, code of conduct and duties**

- (1) A member must have a reasonable knowledge of the Act, this code of conduct and the functions of Preventive Health SA and the Council.
- (2) A member must have a reasonable knowledge of the duties required of members.

#### **5—Acting with integrity**

A member must—

- (a) act impartially (including by not demonstrating bias towards particular groups or individuals) and in the public interest; and
- (b) not make improper use of their position or information to an advantage for themselves or another person; and
- (c) exercise a reasonable degree of care, diligence and skill, including by reading and considering material relevant to meetings of the Council, actively participating in meetings and providing advice based on data, evidence and expert knowledge; and
- (d) attend meetings of the Council except when it is not reasonably practicable to do so (and submit timely apologies in such cases); and

- (e) not do any thing (or omit to do any thing) that might reasonably be regarded as undermining public confidence in the Council or damaging the reputation of the Council; and
- (f) ensure that another member or any other person does not suffer adverse action for alleging a contravention of this code of conduct.

## **6—Acting ethically**

A member must—

- (a) perform their functions (including by providing advice) in a manner that promotes public confidence in the Council and the performance of its functions; and
- (b) ensure that confidential information is dealt with appropriately and that any information obtained as a member is not unlawfully disclosed; and
- (c) not seek out or accept gifts, hospitality or other benefits for themselves or another person that could be reasonably be perceived as influencing the performance of their functions as a member; and
- (d) not commit to or promise action relating to their role as a member for the benefit or another person or body except with the written authorisation of the Council; and
- (e) ensure that their dealings with other persons or bodies are not conducted in a manner that could reasonably be perceived as influencing the performance of their functions as a member; and
- (f) not make public statements relating to their role as a member of the Council except with the written authorisation of the Council.

## **7—Acting respectfully**

A member must—

- (a) not engage in any form of behaviour that is, or may lead to, bullying, harassment and discrimination; and
- (b) actively promote conduct among members that complies with this code of conduct and seek to ensure that the relevant provisions of this code are applied in relation to conduct that does not comply with this code; and
- (c) be inclusive and respectful of other persons, recognise and respect the cultural identity of other persons and consider a range of perspectives in the performance of their functions as a member.

# **Part 3—Compliance with code of conduct**

## **8—Process for dealing with contraventions of code of conduct**

- (1) The Council is responsible for ensuring that alleged contraventions of this code of conduct are dealt with.
- (2) If a member considers that a contravention of this code of conduct has occurred, the member must report the alleged contravention to the Chair.
- (3) Any other person may report an alleged contravention of this code of conduct to the Chair.

- (4) On receipt of a report of an alleged contravention, the Chair—
- (a) must ensure that a record of the report is made and a response is provided to the person who reported the allegation in a timely manner; and
  - (b) may, if satisfied the matter requires investigation, investigate the alleged contravention; and
  - (c) may, if satisfied that the alleged contravention is proven, take action in relation to the contravention that the Chair considers appropriate in the circumstances.

**Note—**

Examples of appropriate action include any 1 or more of the following:

- (a) a reprimand;
- (b) a direction that an apology be given;
- (c) a requirement that training be completed;
- (d) the holding of a meeting and the adoption of a plan of action to address the contravention;
- (e) a recording of a finding that a contravention occurred (without further action);
- (f) the reporting of the matter to the Minister for consideration.

Section 13(3) of the Act provides that the Minister may, at any time, remove a member of the Council from office for any reason the Minister thinks fit (which could include a contravention of this code of conduct).

### 1—Short title

These regulations may be cited as the *Real Property (Registration of Instruments) Amendment Regulations 2026*.

#### 16A—Registration of instruments

- (1) Subject to subregulation (2), an instrument lodged for registration in the Lands Titles Registration Office (including an instrument lodged electronically) for the purposes of the Act may include no more than 20 title references.
- (2) Subregulation (1) does not apply to an instrument, or instrument of a class, declared to be exempt by the Registrar-General.
- (3) The Registrar-General may revoke an exemption under subregulation (2) for any reason the Registrar-General thinks fit.
- (4) In this regulation—

*title reference* means a reference to a certificate of title, Crown lease or Crown record.

### **1—Short title**

These regulations may be cited as the *Planning, Development and Infrastructure (General) (Infrastructure Frameworks) Amendment Regulations 2026*.

These regulations come into operation on the day on which they are made.

## **Part 2—Amendment of *Planning, Development and Infrastructure (General) Regulations 2017***

### **3—Insertion of Part 13A**

After regulation 109 insert:

#### **Part 13A—Infrastructure frameworks**

##### **109A—Provisions relating to ESCOSA's functions (section 169)**

- (1) For the purposes of section 169(2)(c)(iii) of the Act, ESCOSA may conduct inquiries under Part 7 of the *Essential Services Commission Act 2002* in relation to a matter that is relevant to the operation of Part 13 of the *Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016*.

- (2) For the purposes of section 169(2)(d) of the Act, the *Essential Services Commission Act 2002* will apply with the following modifications when ESCOSA is acting under that section:
- (a) the *Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* will be taken to be a relevant industry regulation Act under Part 5 of the *Essential Services Commission Act 2002*;
  - (b) a reference in Part 7 of the *Essential Services Commission Act 2002* to the Minister will be taken to be a reference to the Minister to whom the administration of the *Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* has been committed.

#### **109B—Ranking of charges on land (section 174)**

For the purposes of section 174(1)(b) of the Act, a class of instruments determined by the Minister by notice in the Gazette is a prescribed class of instruments.

#### **109C—Enforcement of charge (section 175)**

For the purposes of section 175(4) of the Act, the following circumstances are prescribed:

- (a) where the Minister considers that the costs of an auction are not justified because of the low value of the land;
- (b) where the Minister has received advice from an independent expert that there are no reasonable prospects of an auction succeeding if a reasonable reserve price is set;
- (c) where the Minister determines that an auction is not a reasonable way to sell the land in the circumstances of the particular case.

#### **109D—Payment of scheme contributions by councils (section 178)**

- (1) Interest accrues under section 178(1) of the Act from the date on which the instalment was payable under that section at the prime bank rate for the relevant financial year, calculated in respect of each month (or part of a month) for which the relevant amount remains unpaid.
- (2) For the purposes of section 178(2) of the Act, in connection with an amount recoverable as a debt under that section—
  - (a) the amount will be recoverable by the entity identified in the relevant funding arrangement as the entity to which contributions are to be paid (for the purposes of payment into a fund under Part 13 Division 1 Subdivision 9 of the Act); and
  - (b) before action is commenced to recover the amount, the entity entitled to commence the action must furnish to the council a notice—
    - (i) setting out the amount due to be paid by the council; and
    - (ii) requesting payment within a period (of at least 1 month) specified in the notice.

(3) In this regulation—

*prime bank rate* for a particular financial year means the corporate loan reference rate applied by the Commonwealth Bank of Australia for corporate lending on the first trading day of the bank in that financial year.

## **Schedule 4—Expiation of offences**

### **Part 1—Preliminary**

#### **1—Expiation of alleged offences**

- (1) The expiation fees set out in this Schedule are fixed for alleged offences against the Act or the rules or regulations specified in this Schedule.
- (2) Text set out in italic type under a heading in this Schedule commencing with the words "Description of offence" is a description for convenience purposes only and is not to be taken to define the offence for which a particular amount is fixed as the expiation fee.

#### **2—Photographic detection devices**

The expiation fee for an alleged offence against section 79B(2) of the Act constituted of being the owner of a vehicle that appears from evidence obtained through the operation of a photographic detection device to have been involved in the commission of an expiable offence is the same as the expiation fee payable for that expiable offence.

#### **3—Expiation fee for certain offences at average speed camera locations**

Despite any other provision of this Schedule, the expiation fee for—

- (a) an alleged offence constituted of a contravention of or failure to comply with—
  - (i) rule 132(2) of the *Australian Road Rules* (Keeping to the left of the centre of a road or the dividing line); or
  - (ii) rule 150(1) of the *Australian Road Rules* (Driving on or across a continuous white edge line); or
- (b) an alleged offence against section 164A(1) of the *Road Traffic Act 1961* constituted of a contravention of or failure to comply with section 110 of the Act (Driving on sealed surface),

is \$1 176 if the contravention or failure to comply takes place within 100 metres of a stub line at an average speed camera location.

#### **4—Expiation fee for certain Road Rules contraventions within 100 metres of Safe-T-Cam photographic detection device**

Despite any other provision of this Schedule, the expiation fee for an alleged offence constituted of contravention by the driver of a heavy vehicle of any of the following provisions of the *Australian Road Rules* is \$721 if the contravention takes place within 100 metres of a Safe-T-Cam photographic detection device:

- (a) rule 95(1) (Emergency stopping lane only signs);
- (b) rule 126 (Keeping a safe distance behind vehicles);
- (c) rule 127(1) (Keeping a minimum distance between long vehicles);
- (d) rule 132(2) (Keeping to the left of the centre of a road or the dividing line);
- (e) rule 146(1) (Driving within a single marked lane or line of traffic);
- (f) rule 147 (Moving from one marked lane to another marked lane across a continuous line separating the lanes);
- (g) rule 150(1) (Driving on or across a continuous white edge line);
- (h) rule 215(1) (Using lights when driving at night or in hazardous weather conditions).

### **5—Lesser expiation fee if motor vehicle not involved**

- (1) Despite the fees fixed in the tables in this Schedule, the expiation fee is \$72 for an alleged offence (other than an offence referred to in subclause (2)) constituted of—
  - (a) driving, towing, stopping or parking a vehicle other than a motor vehicle; or
  - (b) travelling in or on a wheeled recreational device or wheeled toy.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply in the case of—
  - (a) an offence constituted of failing to comply with the lawful directions of a person; or
  - (b) an offence constituted of driving, towing, stopping, parking or travelling in or on, an electric personal transporter; or
  - (c) an offence against regulation 30A(4), (5), (9), (10), (12), (13) or (14) of the *Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2014*; or
  - (d) an offence against section 164A(1) of the Act comprising a contravention of or failure to comply with section 99B(1), 162C(1), 162C(2) or 162C(2a) of the Act; or
  - (e) an offence against rule 240(1), 240(2), 241(1), 244(2), 244B, 244C, 254(2), 256(1), 256(2) or 256(3) of the *Australian Road Rules*.

### **6—Prescribed roads—offences against section 45A of Act involving road trains**

- (1) For the purposes of determining the expiation fee for an offence against section 45A of the Act, a road train is driven on a prescribed road if it is driven on a length of road with a prescribed speed limit (road trains) of 90 kilometres per hour or more.
- (2) In this clause—

***prescribed speed limit (road trains)*** means a prescribed speed limit (road trains) imposed under regulation 8(4) of the *Road Traffic (Road Rules—Ancillary and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations 2014*.

**Note—**

Different penalties apply in respect of road trains being driven on prescribed roads— see the item relating to offences against section 45A in Part 2 of this Schedule.

These regulations may be cited as the *Motor Vehicles (Fees) Amendment Regulations 2026*.
