FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

*Permit No. FM00212*

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, R. Brown Enterprises Pty Ltd (hereinafter referred to as the 'permit holder'), 101 Wells Street, Streaky Bay, S.A. 5680 is exempt from the provisions of sections 44, 48G, 50 and 53 of the Fisheries Act 1982, insofar as the permit holder may engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 subject to the conditions in Schedule 2 in the waters specified in Schedule 3 from the date of this permit until 14 January 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

The importation and release of pacific oyster (*Crassostrea gigas*) within a 5 hectare lease into baskets and racks for research and development at the following coordinates:

SCHEDULE 2

1. The permit holder must maintain adequate security arrangements to prevent escapement of fish (ova, fry or adult) into South Australian waters.

2. Fish obtained within South Australia for use in the fish farm shall only be obtained from registered fish farmers, licensed fishers or other persons approved by the Director of Fisheries.

3. The permit holder must not import any live fish (ova, fry or adult) into South Australia unless the shipment certification from an appropriate authority in the State from which they are obtained that they are free from all relevant notifiable diseases listed in Schedule 4 of the Fisheries (Exotic Fish, Fish Farming and Fish Diseases) Regulations 1984.

4. The permit holder must retain the copy of this permit, and if requested by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer, produce the permit for inspection.

5. The permit holder must provide a bank guarantee or other form of financial security to ensure the site is returned to its natural state once the proposed use has been discontinued.

6. An Environmental Monitoring Program for the site must comply with the general requirements for environmental monitoring specified by the Director of Fisheries.

- (a) consideration of the importance of Gibson Peninsula for shorebirds;
- (b) an assessment of the potential for the development to detrimentally impact on shorebird activity and habitat;
- (c) observations concerning the impact of sand movement on the success of the aquaculture development;
- (d) an assessment of the impact the development has on the marine environment, including benthic communities; and
- (e) the success of oyster growing on site comparison to the Blanch Port area.

7. The permit holder must submit the outcomes of research, pursuant to Condition 6, to PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture, G.P.O. 1625, Adelaide, S.A. 5001, on or before 14 December 1999.
