FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Bruce Weir or his agent (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 126, Barmera, S.A. 5345 is exempt from section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as that the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking mussels (*Vesunio ambiguus*) from waters of the Murray River (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 20 August 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

1. All mussels taken pursuant to this notice are for scientific and research purposes and must not be sold.
2. The exemption holder may only take a maximum of 30 mussels (*Vesunio ambiguus*) pursuant to this notice.
3. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the details of the proposed locations and dates on which the collections are to be made.
4. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity the exemption holder must have in his possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer.
5. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, David Warland and Tracey Warland or their agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') of South Australian Seahorse Services, P.O. Box 5606, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5606, are exempt from the Fisheries Act 1982 but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence

when taking and possessing 2 egg-bearing male and 2 female weedy seadragon (*Phyllopteryx taeniolatus*) (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity') subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from South Australian coastal marine waters from the date of this notice until 30 June 2001.

SCHEDULE 1

1. All seahorses taken pursuant to this notice are for broodstock only and may not be sold or traded without written consent from the Director of Fisheries.
2. Seadragons of the same sex must not be collected within 5 km of each other.
3. The exemption holder shall provide a written report with details of each collection trip to the Director of Fisheries at the completion of the permitted activity.
4. At least twenty-four hours prior to engaging in the permitted activity, the exemption holder must contact the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the following information:
 - the name of the person who will be conducting the permitted activity;
 - the intended location for conducting the permitted activity;
 - the method of conducting the permitted activity; and
 - if using a boat to conduct the permitted activity, the description of the boat and the intended area of launching and retrieval.
5. Whilst engaged in the permitted activity the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that Robert Chirgwin (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), 9 Seaview Road, Kingscote, S.A. 5223, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M039, is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking undersized fish of the species cockles (*Katelysia* spp.), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2001.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The exemption holder may engage in the following fishing activity (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity') namely the taking of undersized fish as specified in Schedule 2, within those waters specified in Schedule 3.

2. Any fish taken by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must be used for bait only and must not be sold.

3. While engaged in the permitted activity, the exemption holder shall carry or have about or near his person, a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a fisheries officer upon request.

4. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulation made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

SCHEDULE 2

Cockles (*Katelysia* spp.) not less than 27 mm in length.

SCHEDULE 3

The waters in the vicinity of Kingscote bounded as follows: Commencing at a point at high water mark at Cape Rouge, latitude 35°35'52"S, and longitude 137°37'32"E, then along the geodesic (190°T), to a point at high water mark on the south coast on the Bay of Shoals, latitude 35°38'18"S, and longitude 137°37'05"E, then following the line of high water mark in a generally easterly and southerly direction to a point at high water mark at the landward end of the Kingscote jetty, latitude 35°39'15"S and longitude 137°38'32"E, then along the geodesic (133°T) for a distance of 2.3 nautical miles to position latitude 35°40'32"S, longitude 137°41'00"E, then along the geodesic (033°T) for a distance of 2.1 nautical miles to a position latitude 35°38'50"S, longitude 137°42'15"E, then along the geodesic (325°T) to a point at high water mark on Marsden Point, latitude 35°33'55"S and longitude 137°38'07"E, then following the line of high water mark in a generally southerly direction back to the point of commencement.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Dr Brian Williams or persons acting as his agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') from University of Adelaide, North Terrace, Adelaide, S.A. 5000 is exempt from the provisions of the Fisheries Act 1982 but only insofar as the exemption holder may engage in the taking of fish as specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2, using gear specified in Schedule 3, in coastal marine and estuarine waters of South Australia from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 August 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

King George Whiting (*Sillaginodes punctata*) below the minimum legal size limit of 30 cm.

SCHEDULE 2

1. No more than 1 000 specimens are to be collected during the term of this exemption.

2. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and may not be sold.

3. Twenty-four hours prior to collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

5. While engaging in the permitted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

5. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

1 seine net (maximum length of which does not exceed 10 m).
