FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Cowell Area School, 42 Story Road, Cowell, S.A. 5602 (hereinafter referred to as the 'fish farmer') is exempt from the provisions of section 50 of the Fisheries Act 1982, in that they shall not be guilty of an offence when importing and releasing Pacific Oysters (*Crassostrea gigas*) and Native Oysters (*Ostrea angasi*) (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity') subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 1 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The fish farmer may only engage in the permitted activity on the premises situated in Franklin Harbour (hereinafter referred to as the 'premises').
2. The fish farmer must ensure that no live fish leave the premises for sale without the clearance by Manager SASQAP.
3. The fish farmer shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
4. The fish farmer must retain a copy of this notice and produce that notice for inspection if requested by a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Mardi van der Wielen, The University of Adelaide Department of Soil and Water, Waite Campus PMB1, Glen Osmond, S.A. 5064 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') is exempt from the provisions of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as the exemption holder may engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), using the gear specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3 from 1 March 2000 until 30 April 2000.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of carp (family cyprinidae), and subsequent release into up to a maximum of 6 metal rings with a maximum diameter of 4.5 m and a maximum height of 0.9 m placed within the waters of the River Murray (including anabranches and tributaries).

SCHEDULE 2

- 1 seine net

SCHEDULE 3

1. All native fish collected pursuant to this exemption must be returned to the water on completion of scientific evaluation.
2. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
3. While engaging in the permitted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.
4. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the permit holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE WORKERS REHABILITATION AND COMPENSATION ACT 1986

No. 20 of 2000

Citation

1. The *Workers Rehabilitation and Compensation (Claims and Registration) Regulations 1999* (see *Gazette* 25 November 1999 p. 2764), as varied, are referred to in these regulations as "the principal regulations".

Commencement

2. These regulations will come into operation on the day on which they are made.

Variation of reg. 12—Special provisions relating to exempt employers

3. Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is varied by inserting after its present contents (now to be designated as subregulation (1)) the following subregulation:

(2) For the purposes of subsection (4) of section 50 of the Act—

- (a) the actuarial guidelines approved by the Corporation from time to time for the purposes of the calculation of financial guarantees under clause 10 of schedule 4; and
- (b) the principle that a scaling factor equal to the scaling factor that applies under clause 10(2)(a) of schedule 4 should be applied to any actuarial determination of the value of liabilities,

are prescribed for estimating and capitalising liabilities under that section.
