FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 and The Sailing Ship Trust of South Australia Inc., P.O. Box 222, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015, (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') are exempt from the provisions of Clauses 71AA and 70(b) of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1984 and section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, insofar as the exemption holder may exceed the boat limits as specified in Schedule 2 (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *One and All* (hereinafter referred to as the 'permitted boat') from The Sailing Ship Trust of South Australia Inc. in South Australian waters for the purpose of recreational fishing.

SCHEDULE 2

The exemption holder may engage in the taking of no more than one half of the daily bag limit for those species of marine scalefish subject to such a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1984 per paying passenger in any one day where the number of paying passengers exceeds five.

SCHEDULE 3

1. This exemption is valid from the date of gazettal of this notice until 5 June 2000.
2. The exemption holder shall not use any boat other than the permitted boat for the purpose of engaging in the permitted activity.
3. The exemption holder shall not sell any fish taken pursuant to this notice.
4. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.
5. While engaged in the permitted activity the exemption holder shall have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.
