FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Leslie Morrison or persons acting as her agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') from the School of Biological Sciences, Flinders University of South Australia, G.P.O. Box 2100, Adelaide, S.A. 5001 is exempt from the provisions of Section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982 to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), using the gear specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

SCHEDULE 1

The collection of marine organisms from all waters of South Australia including intertidal 'rocky' reefs, excluding aquatic reserves.

SCHEDULE 2

- 2 beach seine nets (the maximum length of which does not exceed 50 m)
- 5 drop nets
- 2 plankton nets
- 1 beam trawl net (the maximum width of which does not exceed 2 m)
- 1 cast net
- 10 fish traps
- 1 miniature otter trawl
- hook and line
- butterfly/dab nets
- 1 bait pump

SCHEDULE 3

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and may not be sold.

2. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holders must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

3. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holders must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

4. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, those holders of a licence issued pursuant to the Scheme of Management (Marine Scalefish Fisheries) Regulations 1991 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holders') are exempted from the provisions of Clause 123 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 in that an exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when using a boat registered by endorsement on the licence pursuant to Division 1, Part 4 of the Fisheries Act 1982, for the taking of fish for purposes other than trade or business (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), provided the exemption holder complies with the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

SCHEDULE 1

1. An exemption holder must notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit via Link Communications on 1800 090 654 prior to engaging in the exempted activity with the following information:

- the commercial boat registration number and the fishery licence number to which the call applies;
- the name of the person making the call (must be the licence holder) and the Restricted Marine Scalefish Fishery or Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No.;

- the recreational registration numbers which will be placed on the boat;
- the time and date the exempted activity will commence; and
- the time and date the exempted activity will cease.

2. An exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any other regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

#### FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, those holders of a licence issued pursuant to the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holders') are exempted from the provisions of Clause 123 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 in that an exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when using a boat registered by endorsement on the licence pursuant to Division 1, Part 4 of the Fisheries Act 1982 for the taking of fish for purposes other than trade or business (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), provided the exemption holder complies with the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

#### SCHEDULE 1

1. An exemption holder must notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit via Link Communications on 1800 244 317 prior to engaging in the exempted activity with the following information:

- the commercial boat registration number and the fishery licence number to which the call applies;
- the name of the person making the call (must be the licence holder or a registered master) and the Abalone Fishery Licence No.;

#### FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, subject to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, those holders of a licence issued pursuant to the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991, (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), are exempted from the provisions of regulations 10 (2) (b) of the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991 in that the exemption holder shall be permitted to register a second boat, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2002.

#### SCHEDULE 1

1. The exemption holder may only register an additional boat where no more than one other boat is registered by endorsement of the applicant's licence in respect of the fishery.

2. The exemption holder shall not use both boats, or cause, suffer or permit both boats to be used, within any one day in an act of taking or the act preparatory to or involved in the taking of abalone (*Haliotis* Spp.) pursuant to a licence issued subject to the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991.

3. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any other regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.
