FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Dr John Chuk, 10 Smeaton Road, Clunes, Vic. 3370 (the 'exemption holder') or a person acting as his agent, is exempt from sections 41 and 48G of the Fisheries Act 1982 and the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 insofar as he may engage in the collection of flatworm (*Phylum Plathelminthes*) (the 'exempted activity') from South Australian coastal waters (including intertidal rocky reefs and aquatic reserves), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 December 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holders are for scientific and research purposes only and must not be sold.
2. A maximum of three specimens of any species per location may be taken for the purpose of species identification.
3. Specimens collected pursuant to this notice must only be collected by hand.
4. The only person who may act as an agent of the exemption holder pursuant to this notice is Dr Leslie Newman.
5. Before conducting the exempted activity, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity, details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.
6. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Kristy Power, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within 14 days of any collection, giving the following details:

- the date, time and location of collection;
- the description of all species collected; and
- the number of each species collected.

7. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

8. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Jan Aldenhoven from Cape Green Pty Ltd, P.O. Box 255, Point Lookout, Qld 4183 (the 'exemption holder'), or persons acting as her agent, is exempt from section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982 but only insofar as the exemption holder may engage in the collection of small fish from coastal waters of South Australia, excluding intertidal rocky reefs and aquatic reserves using the gear specified in Schedule 1 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2, from 1 September 2003 until 31 August 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

1 mesh net with a maximum length of 10 m and a minimum mesh size of 1 mm.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for filming purposes only and must not be sold.

2. All fish collected must be returned to the location at which they were collected as soon as practicable after filming.

3. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise PIRSA Fisheries on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

4. The exemption holder must not conduct any other activity whilst undertaking the exempted activity.

5. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice and must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Peter Bell (the 'exemption holder'), P.O. Box 298, Kingscote, S.A. 5223, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M040, is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, regulation 7 and schedule 6 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking undersized fish of the species cockles (*Katelysia* spp.) (the 'exempted activity'), within those waters specified in Schedule 1, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

The waters in the vicinity of Kingscote bounded as follows: Commencing at a point at high water mark at Cape Rouge, latitude 35°35'52"S and longitude 137°37'32"E, then along the geodesic (190°T), to a point at high water mark on the south coast on the Bay of Shoals, latitude 35°38'18"S and longitude 137°37'05"E, then following the line of high water mark in a generally easterly and southerly direction to a point at high water mark at the landward end of the Kingscote jetty, latitude 35°39'15"S and longitude 137°38'32"E, then along the geodesic (133°T) for a distance of 2.3 nautical miles to position latitude 35°40'32"S and longitude 137°41'00"E, then along the geodesic (033°T) for a distance of 2.1 nautical miles to a position latitude 35°38'50"S and longitude 137°42'15"E, then along the geodesic (325°T) to a point at high water mark on Marsden Point, latitude 35°33'55"S and longitude 137°38'07"E, then following the line of high water mark in a generally southerly direction back to the point of commencement.

2. Any fish taken by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must be used for bait only and must not be sold.

3. The exemption holder must include all cockles taken pursuant to this exemption on the monthly catch and effort summary provided to the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI).

4. While engaged in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must carry or have about or near his person, a copy of this notice which must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

5. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulation made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
