FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Jan Aldenhoven or persons acting as her agents (herein-after referred to as the 'exemption holder') from Cape Green Pty Ltd, P.O. Box 255, Point Lookout, Qld, 4183 is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as the exemption holder may engage in the collection of small fish from coastal waters of South Australia, excluding intertidal 'rocky' reefs and aquatic reserves, (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), using the gear specified in Schedule 1, subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 August 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

One mesh net with a maximum length of 10 m and a minimum mesh size of 1 mm.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for filming purposes only and may not be sold.

2. All fish collected must be returned to the location at which they were collected as soon as practicable after filming.

3. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must advise PIRSA Fisheries on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

4. The exemption holder may not conduct any other activity whilst undertaking the exempted activity.

5. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice which must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Helen Tassie, Education Officer of the Malacological Society of South Australia Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') c/o Marine Invertebrates Section, South Australian Museum, North Terrace, Adelaide, S.A. 5000, or her agents are exempt from the provisions of Clause 65 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 to engage in the activities specified in Schedule 1 (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 2 from 14 February 2003 to 20 February 2003 inclusive, unless varied or revoked earlier.

The collection of aquatic organisms from South Australian coastal waters (including intertidal rocky reefs) adjacent to Streaky Bay.

SCHEDULE 2

1. All specimens collected by the exemption holder pursuant to this notice must not be sold.

2. Before collecting any specimens pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must notify PIRSA Fisheries Compliance on 1800 065 522 with details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

3. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must carry identification proving membership of the Malacological Society.

4. Within 14 days of the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice, the exemption holder must provide a report in writing to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Roger Hill, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015), giving the following details:

- the date and time of collection;
- the description of all species collected; and
- the number of each species collected.

5. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

3. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must carry identification proving membership of the Malacological Society.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Prudence Tucker or persons acting as her agents (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder') from the River Murray Catchment Water Management Board, P.O. Box 1374, Berri, S.A. 5343, is exempt from the provisions of section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982, to engage in the collection of fish (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity') from the waters described in Schedule 1, using the gear specified in Schedule 2, subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 3 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 December 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

- 1 dab net per person;
- 20 shrimp traps;
- 8 fyke nets (the maximum length of which does not exceed 10 m, and minimum mesh size of 8.5 mm);
- 2 seine nets (the maximum length of which does not exceed 10 m, and minimum mesh size of 10 mm).

SCHEDULE 3

1. The specimens collected by the exemption holder are for scientific and research purposes only and may not be sold.

2. All fish taken pursuant to the exempted activity must be immediately returned to the water unless retained for the purpose of species identification.

3. A maximum of five fish of any species per location may be taken for the purpose of species identification.

4. Before conducting the exempted activity, the exemption holder must advise the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity, details of the proposed locations and the dates on which the collections are to be made.

5. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the outcomes of the research and the collection of organisms pursuant to this notice to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Roger Hill, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within 3 months of the expiry of this notice, giving the following details:

- the date and time of collection;
- the description of all species collected; and
- the number of each species collected.

6. While engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

7. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982 : SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Peter Heylen (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), 31 Jikara Drive, Glen Osmond, S.A. 5064 is exempt from section 34 of the Fisheries Act 1982, but only insofar as the exemption holder may take European Carp (*Cyprinus carpio*) and Redfin (*Perca fluviatilis*) for sale by the use of gill nets (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity') from the Strathalbyn Reservoir and the Flinders University Lake, subject to the conditions set out in the schedule from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 March 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE

1. All fish caught, except European Carp (*Cyprinus carpio*) and Redfin (*Perca fluviatilis*) must be immediately returned to the water unharmed.

2. The exemption holder shall provide the following information, which is to be recorded on a daily basis when fishing, and provide this information to the Director of Fisheries within 14 days after the expiry of the exemption:

- the weight of catch for each non-native species;
- the number of nets used and the duration of each set;
- the number of any species taken incidentally and returned to the water; and
- the life status of any fish and wildlife returned to the water.

3. The exemption holder may use one agent to assist him with the exempted activity, provided that agent operates with the exemption holder and from the same vessel.

4. All fish transported for sale, shall be transported in bins clearly marked with the number MTB1 and the name, Peter Heylen.

5. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder shall have in his possession a copy of this notice and such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act or any condition of this notice, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
