FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Tracy Warland (the 'exemption holder'), or her agents, of South Australian Seahorse Marine Services, 5 Mallee Crescent, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5606, is exempt from section 42 of the Fisheries Act 1982 and Regulation 6 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking and possessing two adult gravid male leafy sea dragons and two adult female leafy sea dragons (*Phycodorus eques*) from the South Australian coastal waters specified in Schedule 1 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of this notice until 30 June 2004, unless this notice is varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

All waters within three nautical miles of the high water mark on Eyre Peninsula between Port Neill and Cape Finniss.

SCHEDULE 2

1. The specimens collected pursuant to the exempted activity are to be used for display purposes only at South Australian Seahorse Marine Services, 5 Mallee Crescent, Port Lincoln and must not be sold, released or removed from the site without the written permission of the Director of Fisheries.

2. No two specimens of the same sex may be collected within 5 km of each other.

3. The exemption holder shall provide a written report on the number of animals taken, specific location and their condition to the Director of Fisheries (Attention: Roger Hill, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) within 7 days of the completion of each collection.

4. The exemption holder must report any mortalities to the Director of Fisheries within 7 days of the mortality, irrespective of the amount of time that has elapsed since the specimens were collected.

5. At least 24 hours prior to engaging in the exempted activity, the exemption holder must contact the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 with the following information:

- the name of the person who will be conducting the exempted activity;
- the intended location for conducting the exempted activity;
- the method of conducting the exempted activity; and
- if using a boat to conduct the exempted activity, the description of the boat and the intended area of launching and retrieval.

6. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice which must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

7. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice. Dated 21 March 2003.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Tony Lee (hereinafter referred to as the 'exemption holder'), 12 Jenkins Street, Mount Gambier S.A. 5290 is exempt from section 34 of the Fisheries Act 1982 but only insofar as the exemption holder may take turbo (*Turbo undulatis*) for the purpose of trade or business from South Australian coastal waters (hereinafter referred to as the 'exempted activity') subject to the conditions in Schedule 1 from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2003, unless revoked or varied earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The exemption holder may only take turbo (*Turbo undulatis*) by diving and collection by hand.

2. The exemption holder may take no more than a total of 3 000 kg of turbo (*Turbo undulatis*) during the exempted period.

3. The exemption holder must provide the Director of Fisheries with separate statistical catch and effort information, in the form of a daily log as provided by the Director. The exemption holder must fill out the log every day and send a completed monthly log to the Director no later than the 15th day of the following month, to the address specified.

4. The exemption holder shall notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 prior to conducting the exempted activity with the following information:

- details of the boat that will be used to engage in the exempted activity;
- the intended area of conducting the exempted activity; and
- the intended place and time of launching and retrieval of the nominated boat for that day.

5. PIRSA Fisheries retains the right for a Departmental Officer to accompany the exemption holder at any time during fishing operations.

6. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder shall carry or have about or near his person a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

7. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Richard Mezic (the 'exemption holder'), 43 Dutton Terrace, Medindie, S.A. 5081, is exempt from the provisions of:

- section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982 and clause 54 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000; and
- section 41 of the Fisheries Act 1982 and Regulation 5 of the Scheme of Management (Miscellaneous Fishery) Regulations 2000,

but only insofar as the exemption holder shall be able to fish without an additional fishing licence using no more than 10 unregistered fish traps to take slipper lobster (*Ibacus peronii*) for trade or business (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions set out in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 November 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The fish traps must have a tag attached to the buoy that is marked with the name and address of the exemption holder.

2. All fish other than slipper lobster (*Ibacus peronii*) that are taken in the course of the exempted activity must be returned to the water immediately and with as little injury as possible.

3. The exempted activity may only be undertaken in the waters of Spencer Gulf north of $33^{\circ}50$ 'S.

4. Whilst conducting the exempted activity, the exemption holder must only use a boat that is endorsed on Blue Crab Fishery Licence No. K08.

5. The exemption holder must allow a PIRSA Fisheries Departmental Officer to accompany the exemption holder at any time during the exempted activity, if requested.

6. The exemption holder must notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to conducting the exempted activity and provide the following information:

- the intended launch and retrieval time and location;
- · the intended location of all fish traps to be used; and
- details of the boat to be used.

7. The exemption holder must provide a report in writing detailing the daily catch of slipper lobster and other species pursuant to this notice to the Director of Fisheries, (Attention: Roger Hill, P.O. Box 282, Port Adelaide, S.A. 5015) by 15 November 2003.

8. While engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder shall have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be produced.

9. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982 or any Regulation made under that Act or any condition of the licence, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Allan J. Suter, holder of Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M080, (the 'exemption holder'), c/o P.O. Box 780, Ceduna, S.A. 5690, is exempt from Clauses 60 and 74 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking Blue Groper (*Achoerodus gouldii*) in coastal waters of the State (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 31 August 2003, unless varied or revoked earlier.

SCHEDULE 1

1. The exemption holder may take Blue Groper (*Achoerodus gouldii*) not less than 50 cm and not more than 120 cm.

2. The exemption holder may take no more than 20 Blue Groper (*Achoerodus gouldii*) pursuant to this notice.

3. Any fish taken pursuant to this notice must not be sold.

4. The exemption holder must provide all Blue Groper (*Achoerodus gouldii*) not less than 50 cm and less than 60 cm or greater than 100 cm and not more than 120 cm taken pursuant to this notice, to SARDI Aquatic Sciences, as arranged with Scoresby Shepherd of SARDI Aquatic Sciences.

5. Whilst conducting the exempted activity, the exemption holder must only conduct the exempted activity using devices that are endorsed on Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M080.

6. Whilst conducting the exempted activity, the exemption holder must only use a boat that is endorsed on Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M080.

7. The exemption holder must allow a PIRSA Fisheries Departmental Officer or an employee of SARDI Aquatic Sciences to observe the exempted activity at any time, if requested. 8. The exemption holder must notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit on 1800 065 522 at least 24 hours prior to conducting the exempted activity and provide the following information:

• the intended launch and retrieval time and location;

- the intended fishing area; and
- details of the boat to be used.

9. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer.

10. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
