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## FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Rolf Czabayski, c/o Calypso Star Charter Pty Ltd, 5 Willowbridge Grove, Burnside, S.A. 5066 (the 'principal exemption holder'), and the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (the 'other exemption holders'), are exempt from the provisions of clauses 66, 70, 73, 77A and 77C of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, insofar as the exemption holders may take the number of fish specified in Schedule 2 in the circumstances specified in Schedule 2 (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 3.

## SCHEDULE 1

Any person or persons who charter the boat *Calypso Star* from the principal exemption holder in South Australia, for the purpose of recreational fishing for scalefish, abalone or rock lobster.

## SCHEDULE 2

1. Where the number of other exemption holders exceeds eight, each other exemption holder may take no more than one rock lobster (*Jasus edwardsii*) in any one day.

2. Where the number of other exemption holders exceeds ten, each other exemption holder may take no more than one abalone (*Haliotis* spp.) in any one day.

3. Where the number of other exemption holders exceeds six, each other exemption holder may take no more than one half of the daily bag limit (rounded up to nearest whole number if necessary) for those species of scalefish subject to such a limit as specified in the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 in any one day.

## SCHEDULE 3

1. This exemption is valid until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

2. The principal exemption holder must not use any other boat other than the *Calypso Star* for the purpose of engaging in the exempted activity.

3. The principal exemption holder must not accept any fish taken by the other exemption holders as all or part of the consideration for the charter agreement.

4. While engaged in the exempted activity the principal exemption holder shall have in their possession a copy of this notice. Such notice must be produced to a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer if such an officer requests that it be so produced.

5. The principal exemption holder or the other exemption holders must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

6. The principal exemption holder must not cause, suffer or permit any other exemption holder to contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

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## FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, those holders of a licence issued pursuant to the Scheme of Management (Marine Scalefish Fisheries) Regulations 1991, the Scheme of Management (Miscellaneous Fishery) Regulations 2000, the Scheme of Management (Blue Crab Fishery) Regulations 1998, the Scheme of Management (Prawn Fisheries) Regulations 1991, the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991, the Scheme of Management (River Fishery) Regulations 1991 and the Scheme of Management (Lakes and Coorong Fishery) Regulations 1991 (the 'exemption holders') are exempted from the provisions of clause 123 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 in that an exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when using a boat registered by endorsement on the licence pursuant to Division 1, Part 4 of the Fisheries Act 1982 for the taking of fish for purposes other than trade or business (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from 1 July 2003 until 30 June 2004, unless this notice is varied or revoked earlier.

## SCHEDULE 1

1. An exemption holder must notify the PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Unit via Link Communications on 1800 065 522 prior to engaging in the exempted activity with the following information:

- the commercial boat registration number and the fishery licence number to which the call applies;
- the name of the person making the call (must be the licence holder) and the licence number;
- the recreational registration numbers which will be placed on the boat;
- the time and date the exempted activity will commence; and
- the time and date the exempted activity will cease.

2. An exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any other regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

## FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, the class of persons specified in Schedule 1 (the 'exemption holders'), are exempted from the provisions of Regulation 19 (5) of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000 but only insofar as the exemption holders shall not be guilty of an offence when removing abalone from its shell at sea and having possession, control or custody of abalone that had been removed from its shell, subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from 1 July 2003 until 30 June 2004, unless this notice is varied or revoked earlier.

## SCHEDULE 1

Those persons, or their registered masters, who hold a licence pursuant to the Scheme of Management (Abalone Fisheries) Regulations 1991 for the Central Zone Abalone Fishery.

## SCHEDULE 2

The exemption holders shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any other regulations made under that Act except where specifically exempted by this notice.

## FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Jethro Wild, East Terrace, Streaky Bay, S.A. 5680 (the 'exemption holder') is exempt from the provisions of clause 61 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking up to 150 razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) in any one day from South Australian coastal waters (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

## SCHEDULE 1

1. The exemption holder may only undertake the exempted activity when using a boat registered and endorsed on Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M403.

2. All razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken pursuant to this notice shall be used for bait only.

3. The total number of razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken in any one day, shall be no greater than 150.

4. The exemption holder must include all razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken under this permit on the monthly catch and effort summary provided to the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI).

5. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer forthwith, if and when an officer requests the exemption holder to produce it.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

## FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Michael Kilowsky, 11 Centenary Road, Streaky Bay, S.A. 5680 (the 'exemption holder') is exempt from the provisions of clause 61 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000, but only insofar as the exemption holder shall not be guilty of an offence when taking up to 150 razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) in any one day from South Australian coastal waters (the 'exempted activity'), subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 1, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 June 2004, unless varied or revoked earlier.

## SCHEDULE 1

1. The exemption holder may only undertake the exempted activity when using a boat registered and endorsed on Marine Scalefish Fishery Licence No. M277.

2. All razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken pursuant to this notice shall be used for bait only.

3. The total number of razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken in any one day, shall be no greater than 150.

4. The exemption holder must include all razor fish (*Pinna bicolor*) taken under this permit on the monthly catch and effort summary provided to the South Australian Research and Development Institute (SARDI).

5. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must have in their possession a copy of this notice and produce a copy of the notice if required by a PIRSA Fisheries Compliance Officer, if and when an officer requests the exemption holder to produce it.

6. The exemption holder shall not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under the Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.

#### FISHERIES ACT 1982: SECTION 59

TAKE notice that, pursuant to section 59 of the Fisheries Act 1982, Glyn Chillingworth (the 'exemption holder') of Clean Seas Aquaculture Growout Pty Ltd, Box 159, Port Lincoln, S.A. 5606 or his agents is exempt from:

- sections 41 and 42 of the Fisheries Act 1982; and
- regulation 5 and clause 66 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000; and
- regulation 5 and clause 134 of Schedule 1 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000; and
- regulation 7 and Schedule 6 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 2000,

but only insofar as he may fish for yellowtail kingfish (*Seriola lalandi*) using fish traps or a purse seine net within the lease sites described in Schedule 1 (the 'exempted activity') subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 2, from the date of gazettal of this notice until 30 July 2003.

#### SCHEDULE 2

1. The exemption holder may only undertake the exempted activity in accordance with any procedure set out in the conditions of a licence granted under the Aquaculture Act 2001.

2. The exemption holder may use up to 12 fish traps to undertake the exempted activity.

3. The fish traps must not have dimensions greater than 165 cm x 135 cm x 90 cm and must be covered with wire or weld mesh that has a minimum mesh size of 37 mm.

4. Each trap must be retrieved and all fish removed within 24 hours of the trap being set.

5. The exemption holder may use one purse seine net with a maximum length of 200 m to undertake the exempted activity.

6. Any other species other than yellowtail kingfish that are taken in the course of the exempted activity must be returned to the water immediately with as little injury as possible.

7. Yellowtail kingfish that are taken in the course of the exempted activity must be returned live to finfish aquaculture cages on the lease sites described in Schedule 1.

8. Whilst engaged in the exempted activity the exemption holder must be in possession of a copy of this notice which must be produced to a Department of Primary Industries and Resources Fisheries Compliance Officer upon request.

9. The exemption holder must not contravene or fail to comply with the Fisheries Act 1982, or any regulations made under that Act, except where specifically exempted by this notice.
