DOG AND CAT MANAGEMENT ACT (DUTIES RELATING
TO CERTAIN CLASSES OF DOGS) NOTICE 2006

*Under Section 45D (3) and Section 45E of the Dog and
Cat Management Act 1995*

1. *Short title*

This notice may be cited as the *Dog and Cat Management Act (Duties Relating to Certain Classes of Dogs) Notice 2006*.

2. *Commencement*

This notice comes into operation on the day on which it is made.

3. *Interpretation*

In this notice:

'Act' means the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*.

4. *Notice made by Board*

This notice is made by the Dog and Cat Management Board.

5. *Application of Section 45D*

Pursuant to section 45D (3) of the Act, 1 July 2006 is declared to be the day from which the provisions of section 45D apply in respect of attack trained dogs, guard dogs and patrol dogs within the area of the Councils specified in Schedule 1.

6. *Exemption from certain provisions of Section 45D*

Pursuant to section 45E:

- (a) A person who owns, or is responsible for the control of, an attack trained dog, a guard dog or a patrol dog is exempt from complying with section 45D (1) (b).
- (b) A person who owns, or is responsible for the control of, an attack trained dog or a patrol dog is exempt from complying with section 45D (1) (d).
- (c) Dogs that have previously been exempted under section 9 if in the care and custody of the person responsible for the dog at the time of that exemption, are exempt from section 45D (1) (e).

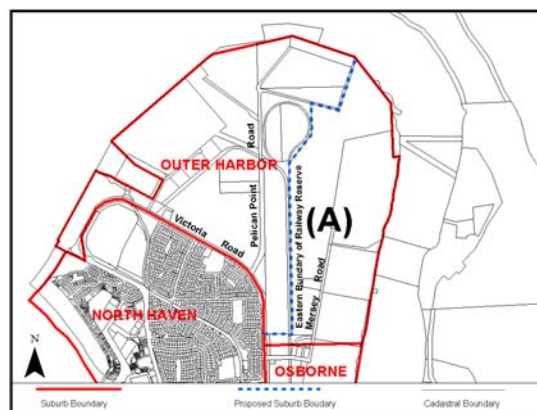

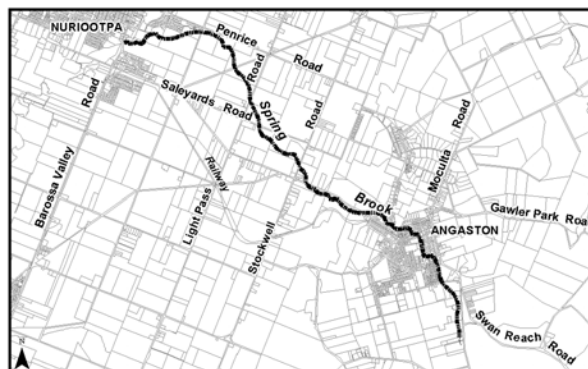
