LIVESTOCK ACT 1997, SECTION 33: VARIATION TO PROHIBITION OF ENTRY OF HORSES AND OTHER EQUINE ANIMALS AND USED EQUIPMENT AND OTHER PROPERTY INTO THE STATE OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

NOTICE BY THE MINISTER

Preamble

1. On 3 September 2007 the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette* (dated 3 September 2007, page 3607), prohibited the introduction into South Australia of horses and related equines, used equipment and fittings used in relation to horses and related equines except by written authority of an Inspector, for the purpose of preventing the introduction and spread of the declared exotic disease Equine Influenza.

2. It is now considered necessary to vary the notice in the following manner:

NOTICE

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Livestock Act 1997, I, Paul Holloway, Acting Minister for Agriculture, Food and Fisheries, vary the notice referred to in Clause 1 of the preamble by amending Clauses 2 and 3 of that notice in the following manner:

2. any used equipment and fittings (including but not limited to halters, bridles and associated fittings, saddles, rugs, brushes, clothes, boots, buckets and other articles which have been brought into contact with horses and related equines) except as provided in any written authority given by an Inspector duly appointed under the Livestock Act 1997; and

3. any horse or related equine transports and floats except as provided in any written authority given by an Inspector duly appointed under the Livestock Act 1997; and

include the following Clause:

4. any product from horses and related equines including:

- (a) the carcase or the portion of a carcase of any horse or related equine; and
- (b) the meat, blood, hide, skin, hair, feet or offal of any horse or related equine; and
- (c) the secretions, excretions, manure and other wastes of horses and related equines, and
- (d) chilled semen or frozen semen, ova, embryos, stem cell and other biological material from horses or related equines;

but does not include cooked equine product, except as provided in any written authority given by an Inspector duly appointed under the Livestock Act 1997.

For the purposes of this notice:

'horses or related equines' means horses, donkeys, mules and other animals in the *Equidae* family.
